

Soren Christensen, (Dane,) of this place, was shot and instantly killed in the mountains west of here, yesterday,

the mountains west of here, yesterday, while out hunting deer. A party, consisting of Martin, Chris. and "Dolph" Taylor, the deceased and Amos Bradley, had been out for sev-eral days. All but "Dolph had camped together the previous night; he, hav-ing become lost, and not arriving, the party scattered next morning to seek party scattered next morning to seek him, soon after which he made his

They had gone but a short distance when Taylor thought he saw a deer moving in the thick brush about a hundred yards ahead, he immediately took aim and fired. The two circled off in different directions, to head off the supposed game, for which they hunted some fifteen minutes, when they found Christensen in the place where Taylor thought he had seen the deer. The ball entered below the right ear and came out at the upper part of the left side of the head, scattering the brains in all directions. Taylor is filled with horror and re-morse at having unintentionally slain
