T tract: "William Busch fired his house, murdered his boy and killed him-self, at the Colorado smelter, near Butte, about 4 o'clock yesterday morning. The whistles and the fire bells sounded the alarm at 4 o'clock, and crowds of people, excited by the late deplorable fire, rushed to the scene, little knowing that the burning walls concealed the traces of the most detestable crime known in the annals of the Pacific coast. The People's Convention of Salt Lake City is hereby called to con-vene at the City Hall of Salt Lake City, on Wednesday, February 8th, 1882, at 7 o'clock p.m., to nominate candidates to be voted for at the municipal election, on Monday, the 13th day of February, 1882.
