### THAT EPISTLE.

THE epistle from Presidents Taylor and Cannon which appeared in yesterday's issue of the NEWS will doubtless be greatly appreciated by the Saints generally, as it was by those to whom it was read in the Conference at Logan on Sunday afternoon. Indeed the perusal of it ought to convince any reasonable fair-minded person, not only of the sincerity of the writers, but of the justice of the cause which they represent.
