State law might be more operative. Shingles have served a good purpose, and they will continue to do so, in detached buildings, villas, or villages. But they are unsuitable for closely built towns and cities. If lumber could be made really incombustible, by any preparation at a reasonable cost no better building material could be found, and as it is it can not be safely supplanted, except in part, even by iron, for it has been demonstrated that a solid stick of timber in a building is
