TERRITORIAL ITEMS.—The following were received by Denver Telegraph:

PROVO, 3.
Judge Strickland is on the rampage. A grand jury were in session this morning but not this p.m. The judge stopped the naturalization business to again lecture on the compensation of jurors. The jurors are not yet charged on Territorial business. The judge complained that he could not learn that jurors had been paid, or that the jurors are daily paid had been properly appropriated. He did not know whether the jurors before the court could be paid without Congressional legislation, but hoped to be able to pay them by December. He said there is a quarrel between the court and the Territory as to who shall pay the juror expenses, and submitted the law provided for the county courts to pay jurors. He had read the law but could not learn whether jurors had been paid. The jury, in this district, are that Utah County court did pay all the fees of the jury for the entire district until Judge Strickland, while on the bench, a year ago, said it is unfair that one county alone should pay these expenses, and suggested that there be a division of the expenses among the counties of the district, since which time Utah county has only paid when the cases originated in Utah county. The judge might have learned these facts if he had breathed a wish to learn the truth of the matter. He is very technical on social matters.

FAIRVIEW, 3.
The weather is warm and pleasant. The people are farming and planting fruit and cattle from north to south. Grain is in and there are no signs of grasshoppers and scarcely any of their eggs to be seen anywhere. Prospecting is going on in the hills around here briskly, and several silver ledges are reported found, which are said to be valuable. A specimen of the quartz has been sent to the city to be assayed. Everything is moving on here. A co-operative sheep herd was started yesterday, and a co-operative cattle herd will soon. One store declared a dividend of 25 per cent. for last quarter.

PARIS, Rich Co., April 30.
Grain sowing is completed in this valley, with most favorable weather. There are rumors of grasshoppers at the south end of the lake. A carding and planing machine has been sent for by Rich Co., which will be a great benefit to this country, when running.

New settlers are arriving. The roads from the south, via Cache Co., are reported very good. The health of the people is generally excellent.

CO-OPERATIVE STOCK RAISING AND HERDING IN WEBER COUNTY.—During the past two days a large number of young stock have been collected from the settlements in this county and driven to the Tithing Yard in this city. To-day the animals will be sent to the new Co-operative herd grounds.

A cow herd has been organized in this city, into which our citizens can put their milk cows instead of selling them for slaughter and break into their neighbors' lots and destroy their orchards and garden trucks. The herd starts from Tithing Yard about seven o'clock every morning. *Denver Journal, May 3d.*

IN TOWN.—Major Powell, the Colorado explorer, accompanied by his wife and Mr. and Mrs. Thompson arrived in town last night. The two ladies are sisters, and they will reside in this city during the summer, while the Major and his party, of which Mr. Thompson is a member, will proceed to Green River, down which a descent will again be made to the scene of the Major's former labors. It is the intention to give the region between the Utah mountains and the mouth of the Rio Virgin a pretty thorough exploration. The waters of Green River are much lower than the Major expected to find them at this season, and in consequence the work will be a week or two before he can leave. From the Major's earnestness in the cause and his extensive scientific attainments there is good reason to expect that the result of his exploration will be that a fund of topographical information will be given to the world regarding this all-important but unknown country.

A NEW DAILY PAPER.—We received this morning the first number of the Denver Daily Journal, a paper published at that city by Messrs. Kagon and Marick. The number contains several apologies for its appearance, for the lack of original matter, for the absence of some material which had not come to hand, etc. But we think the publishers need not have any such excuses for the paper presents a very creditable appearance, the body looks as if it were well made and the make up is tasteful. The Journal is not issued as a political organ, though the political cast will be Republican; the organ of the publishers' common sense, and in high hopes for the future of Colorado, which, if realized, will be likely to furnish it with a prosperous future.

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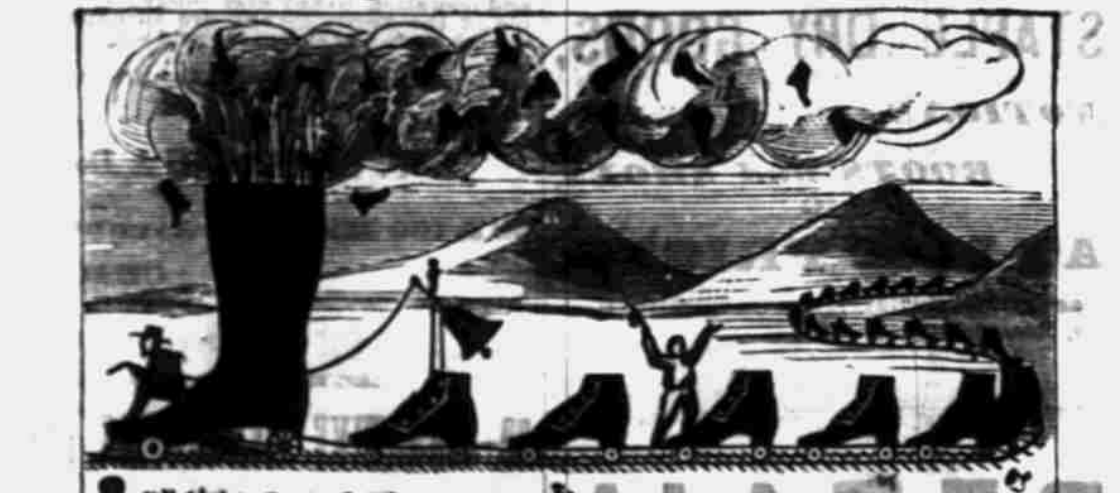
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
