## CURRENCY REFORM.

Two Different Plans Now Attract Much Attention.

## SEC. CARLISLE'S PROPOSITION.

Comptroller of Currency Eases' Scheme and Its Practical Workings.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 7.—Mr. Carlisle's plan of currency reform is naturally attracting great attention in and out of Congress. When applied to practice it will produce the following result: Taking for the purpose of illustration the example of a bank having \$100,000 capital, such a bank would be entitled to issue notes up to the sum of \$75,000 (5 per cent of capital), but before doing so must deposit "legal tender" notes to the amount of \$22,000 (30 per cent of circulation). This, in effect, would be equivalent in a net basis of \$23,000 in circulation by the bank, or \$23,000 received in notes from the government, minus \$2,000 in notes deposited with the government.

Upon this 30 per cent of currency, the bank can issue its profit provided it keeps them in circulation, after deducting costs for redemption to the "safety fund" and fees for administration of controller's bureau.

"As a plan for settling the financial difficulties of the nation, and especially of redeeming United States notes, it would, according to the secretary's estimate, result in securing the temporary deposit of \$22,000,000 of these notes with the government if the nation's note banks now in existence should take out circulation to the full amount proposed."

"Let us see how this result could be arrived at. At present capital of all national banks in existence is about \$900,000,000. If to this we add approximately \$100,000,000 of notes now available themselves of the privileges, a total capital of \$1,000,000,000 would be had as the basic upon which to issue currency. Assuming that all the banks possessing this capital should issue currency on the same basis, the result would be notes in issue of 50 per cent of which are notes of bank currency to the amount of \$250,000,000. Against this, legal tenders to the amount of 20 per cent of circulation must be discounted, or \$22,000,000."

"This will give the effect of a loan upon the vaults of the nation's note banks."

"Add this bank note issued \$250,000 less national bank currency retired \$12,000,000, legal tenders deposited in withdrawal from circulation \$20,000,000, and the increase in circulation, \$20,000,000."

"Assuming that this increase could be kept in circulation, a withdrawal of \$22,000,000 of United States notes is effected temporarily, but as there are \$900,000,000 of notes in circulation, and as the nation's note banks still retain considerable a major portion of the mass, to harass the treasury by presentation for redemption in gold, if the \$250,000,000 is not kept in circulation, the amount of legal tenders existing by reason of the discounting of the notes would be added to the large sum not funded."

"Again, if the legislature disapproves the banks is to be used for redemption of these notes on presentation, there would be no difficulty in securing any amount of them by presenting them to the officials. Being convinced bright with this letter Avery consented."
