There is a movement on hand to establish a creamery at Benner valley, Mountain Home. The milk from the section can keep a few days down, but the milk products being more than the demand, they have decided upon this step. It is said that the milk from 250 to 300 cows will be sent there the year round.

Quite a scuffle has been going on between several Highball citizens in an effort to increase and thus secure the right of purchase of university land, says the Advocate. When plots had been set by one man for a fence, others have regarded that as not being sufficient, and have been pushing up the land.

The deputy assessors of San Diego, Cal., have been able to collect the tax from only about seventy-five Chinese, and to save the 300 remaining they have resorted to street fines. More are to be levied and late taxes before the public is given time to discuss, which will compels each to pay \$10 fine. The officers think the other Chinese will pay \$2 apiece to save themselves.

A ranchman near Granger says that a war has been opened on gophers, when they have eaten up all the grain in his fields. The capture of a single gopher is filled with strychnine and left on a "trap." The little striped squirrels are mammals and feed from the remains of the dead. In this way scores have been killed.

Joseph Commissal, representing B. P. Roberts of the L. & N. R. Co., which makes numerous cattle purchases throughout the country of late, says the Hesler (Nev.) Co., particularly in Stock and Cave Valley, and even in Sheep and Sheep Ranch, has been extremely successful, having included in the sale a number of choice steers from his land. The prices are a little in advance of those paid last year, notwithstanding that the condition of the cattle from the recent stamp is poor.

A statement in a Nevada paper that the tracks of the Central Pacific railroad is to be changed from broad to narrow gauge between Mountaineer station and Reno is contradicted shortly by officials of that road, who say the gauge would remain the same. The road is to be built through the Central Pacific to Virginia. They report that the line of the Carson and Colorado railroad is soon to be extended to its present terminus at Keween to Port Harrison, south of Santa Monica, California.

Alphonso Hudson, a boy about fourteen years of age, was riding a horse on Monday in the fields near College Ward, Logan, when a rabbit hopped from some brush directly in front of the animal, causing it to jump suddenly. The boy, who was wearing a coat, the upper portion of which was sharp, stepped on his head. One of the sharp heel nails entered just under the jaw bone, near the skin, and forced its way through the flesh and bone until his mother, Mrs. Hudson, who was looking broken and the boy sprang over several paces of brush before reaching Dr. Ormsby's office, where several other passes were removed and the ragged, lancing wound closed up.

A report has reached Phoenix that a band of Apaches, heavily armed, eighty miles out from Phoenix, on Cave Creek. They have suffered losses and are determined to get everything they wanted. A little boy, the son of J. A. Haskett, a station master near Phoenix, has rapidly advanced in the art of shooting, and has had many successes, and every one of the Indians, according to his report, is a marksman. The Indians said they had no food, and needed none, and were going to the Colorado river. They also stated there were too many of the party. Many other house tribes were seen. Even soldiers, horses and cattle were present. The citizens of Cave Creek think the kid and his men are going to join the Indians near Whiteman's hill.

While the section of country around Great Falls, Montana, is enjoying spring days continued severely along the Canadian border, it is caused by the terrible physical condition of the Indians, who have been who have lost their lives through the severe weather.
