The burdock was originally brought to Utah for a household medicine, and it has certain medicinal properties. Its roots and leaves are used in blood and skin diseases, and the fresh leaves and skin diseases, and the fresh leaves are applied externally upon swellings and ulcers. Burdock is one of the most common weeds, and was introduced from the Oid World. It is a coarse, unsightly blennial, which grows from three to seven feet high, with a round fleshy, grooved and harry stem, leaves often 18 inches long, alternate, on long deeply furrowed leaf stalks; thin, roundish, oval, or heart shaped; with even, wavy, or toothed margins; smooth above, and pale and woolly be-neath. Flowers purple, in heads armed with hooked tips, which make them almost as great a pest as the cocklebur. One plant may bear 400,000 seeds. Seeding should be prevented and the plant should be grubbed out in summer, taking care to cut the thick root. The seed with its covering is dark brown, one sixth of an inch long, with a beak and pappus of fine hairs, with which it flies through the air. The akene bears five or six roughened ridges. The young plants are eaten by sheep and cattle. Re-peated mowing before seeding is rec-ommended. or thorough cultivation with a hoed crop. Care should be taken not to plow under the mature plants. weed known as the dagger cocklebur, where such weed shall be found grow-ing upon the public highways." "Sec. 4211. The owners or occupants of lands shall carefully extirpate such

weed when the same is found growing upon the land of such owner or occu-pant," etc. "Sec. 4212.
