Chicago, Oct. 9.--The Republic Life Insurance company of Illinois, the \$1,-000,000 life insurance of the Rhodus 000,000 life insurance of the knodus Brothers, which was to have back of it the \$5,000,000 Central Life Securities company as a holding company, will be reorganized with a number of well known Chicago men at the head, and will enter actively into the insurance field.

The steps toward a reorganization of the company were taken last Mon-day in the United States circuit court when Birst F. Rhodus and the other officers and directors of the company capitulated to Judge Kohlsaat's ultim-atum to the effect that the company would be placed in receivers' hands un-less they retired, and when the court approved of the new officers selected by John C.
