STATE HEALTH FOR OCTOBER.

Deaths From All Causes During Month Numbered 323.

The October bulletin of the Utah state board of health was published this morning. It gives the number of deaths from all causes at 323, with 11 deaths not reported the previous month. One hundred and six districts reported no deaths, with 41 localities free from contagious diseases. Scarlet fever—96 cases, 46 deaths; diphtheria—17 cases, one death; typhoid fever—28 cases, 32 deaths; whooping-cough—75 cases, three deaths; measles—10 cases, no deaths; chicken-pox—194 cases, no deaths; pneumonia—


