STATE HEALTH FOR OCTOBER.

Deaths From All Causes During Month Numbered 333.

The October bulletin of the Utah state board of health was published this morning. It gives the number of deaths from all causes at 333, with 11 deaths not reported the previous month. One hundred and six districts reported no deaths, with 61 localities free from contagious diseases. Scarlet fever—36 cases, four deaths; measles—117 cases, one death; diphtheria, 57 cases, one death; typhoid fever, 33 cases, 32 deaths; whooping cough—75 cases, three deaths; measles—10 cases, no deaths; chicken-pox—104 cases, no deaths; pneumonia—
