

CHAPTER XXV. OF LICENSES. An ACT authorizing County Courts to gran Licenses.

Election 1.—Be it emacted by the Governor and Legislatile Assembly of the Tarritory of Unit. That on and after the first day of April, eighteen hundred and eighty four, no person shall be permitted to carry on the business of merchants, retailers, preddlers, auctioneers, brokers, pawnbrokers, money changers, travelers, traveling showman, there therefore the country fourts in their respective counties, as bereinafter provided.

SEC 2.—The county court in their respective counties are herefor at the first election of this act. They hall also provide as entable book of printed forms with study, said atube shall countain a duplicate copy of all licenses issued, and they shall be numbered consecutively; said country causts shall at the price of all because granted by them, which price shall be uniform for all ficenses of the same class and shall not exceed for any one license on any business named in this act the sum of one hundred dollars for any one year; Provided, That the price fixed for a quarter reservice there may be made the price for any time loss than three months; and said county courts, shall require payment for all incenses layariably in advance. Upon the applicant paying the required amount to the country clerk, said clerk shall issue the lagrance for any term not exceeding one rearrest liverse for any term not exceeding one rearrest.

sec. 3.—No such license shall be transfer able unless such transfer shallbe santtioned by the county court or probate judge.

SEC. 4.—If any person shall violate the provisions of any of the preceding sections of this act, he shall be guity of a unisdemeanor.
SEC. 5.—Nothing in this act shall be construed to apply to peddlers of perishable fruits and vegetables, nor to any person carrying on business in an incorporated city.


