than 60 per cent of the steel propert es, and that this purpose has been per es-vered in for several years past, with the object of preventing the acquisi-tions, and as a matter of fact their proportion of steel properties has slightly decreased, so that it is below this 60 per cent, and the acquisition of the property in question will not raise it above 60 per cent. "I have thus given to the senate all the information in the possession of the executive departments which appears to me to be material or relevent on the subject of the resolution. I feel bound, however, to add that I have instructed the attorney-general not to respond to that portion of the resolution which calls for a statement of his reasons for non-action.
