

BY TELEGRAPH.

LONDON, 12—The rate of discount of the bank of England has been reduced one per cent., and is now five per cent.

A meeting in support of the Tichborne claimant was held at St. James' Hall last night. The principal speakers were, Whalley, M. P., Onslow and the claimant himself.

The News publishes a letter from Garibaldi to his Italian friends, in which he says he joined France in 1870 purely from devotion to Democratic principles, yet he feels a pang of sorrow because he had to fight against those noble Germans who, in their progress toward truth, are struggling against the hydra of Jesuitism.

PARIS, 12—The Left in the Assembly are much censured for raising inopportunistly the question of dissolution, and their giving the Germans the pretext for rejecting the guarantees for the payment of the war indemnity, and an excuse for refusing to evacuate the territory.

BERLIN.—News has been received of Mauch, the German explorer in Africa. He had arrived at Gullimane, on his way home, in good health.

LONDON, 14—A dispatch from Nantes reports that the river Seine is overflowed and the adjacent country flooded. The quays in the lower quarters of Nantes are entirely under water, presenting a fearful spectacle.

Disraeli's health is greatly impaired. A special dispatch from Berlin, says Bismarck is looking exceedingly well and will perhaps consent to remain at the head of the Prussian cabinet, if ministers Selchow and Itzenplitz, who opposed the reconstruction of the Herrenhaus, will resign.

A Paris dispatch to the Times says it is more than ever evident that the majority of the Assembly is in direct opposition to President Thiers and one or other must yield. The country supports the President.

ROME, 15—The committee of the chamber of deputies who have under consideration the religious corporations bill, at the sitting yesterday adopted a resolution declaring that the suppression of the society of Jesus, including the chief establishment of the order, in Rome, was imperatively demanded by the interests of the nation.

MADRID, 14—Prest. Zorrilla yesterday announced in the Cortes that the subscriptions to the new loan of 250,000,000 pesetas, opened on the 13th inst., were three times greater than the sum required.

A bill was introduced in the Cortes yesterday providing for universal compulsory military service.

LONDON, 14—The report which was current of the intended railroad strikes on the 2d of January is unfounded.

PARIS, 14—The heavy rains in the northeastern departments have swollen the streams to an unusual height, and several of them are overflowed, inundating the country. Part of the city of Lille is flooded and abandoned, many factories are closed and several bridges entirely submerged.

Monarchist journals are greatly pleased with the stand taken by Dufaure. LONDON, 15—Viscountess Beaconsfield, wife of Disraeli, died at noon today.

HAVANA, 12—The horse disease appeared on Saturday and is daily increasing. There are no private carriages on the streets. A few deaths are reported.

TOLEDO, 16.—A fire yesterday destroyed Warren & Bailey's coffee and spice mills, and a block and four stores occupied by the Wiher, Halsted & Co. tobacco store, and the Ohio stove works; loss \$250,000. James Welch, a fireman, fell from the third story and was killed; several others were hurt by the falling walls.

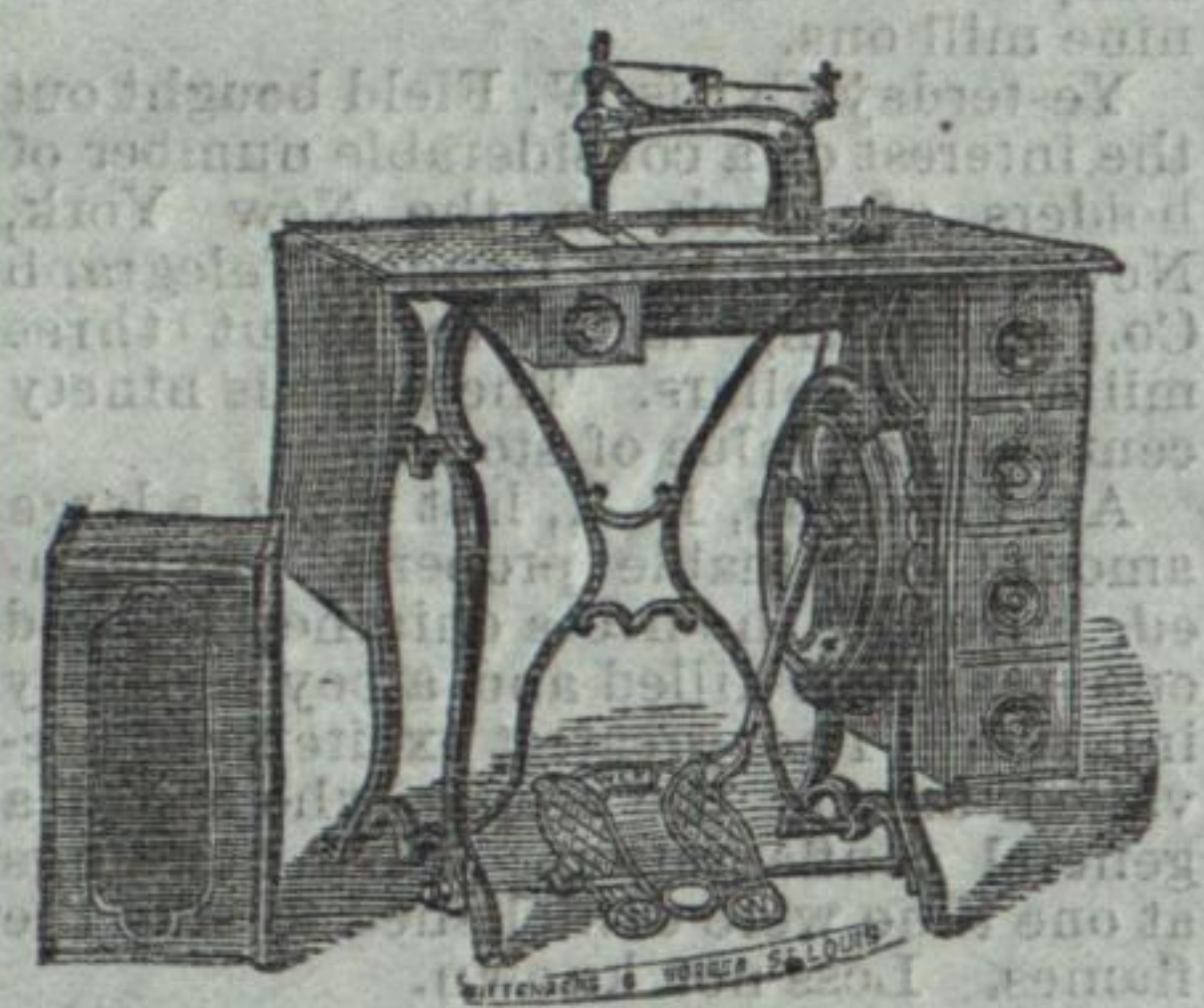
ST. LOUIS, 16.—By the explosion of a boiler in a saw mill in Wayne county on Friday, fourteen were killed outright, and three others wounded.
