

Something of the Career of a Prominent Californian Well Known in Utah.

San Francisco Chronicle. Alexander Badam died at midnight last night. He had been a sufferer for some time from an asthmatic affection and for several weeks past had been seriously ill and confined to his residence, 114 Franklin street. He had been a citizen of this city for a great many years, had taken a prominent part in municipal affairs and was one of the most widely known Californians.

He was a wife and three children. The daughter, Mrs. Frank Bradford, lives at San Jose and is expected to arrive this morning, not being able to travel from that city. The son, Alexander B. Badam, aged 26, and Edgar B. Badam, aged 23, are the machine business in the Crocker building. Edgar was with his father when the latter made his will.

Mr. Badam was born in Cleveland, O., in 1835, although his parents were of sturdy New England stock and were the colonial days his ancestors played an illustrious part in the community in which they lived. He received his early education at Cambridge, Mass., in the public schools, crossed the plains in 1857 with his parents, who settled in Sacramento. Mining was the first employment, young Badam found in California, and he went to work at Lake City in Arizone county. After saving a little money he entered into partnership in a store of general merchandise with a partner with which he published a newspaper.

In 1864, at the early age of 27, he was elected to the state legislature as a Republican, by a large majority. He distinguished himself by his business and political sagacity in connection with numerous corrupt bills. Out of gratitude the people of his district re-elected him to the office of assessor. He removed to San Francisco later and made this city his place of residence continuously from that time. In September, when the late Governor Palmer was succeeded by him, he received the unanimous nomination of the Independent Municipal convention as a candidate for the place of supervisor of the fifth ward, in which enterprise he was assisted by his sons. As one of the chief promoters of the Independent Fair his services to the public were timely and were freely given without compensation.

Notwithstanding his busy life, he found time for writing, and was the author, only a few years ago, of a work entitled "The Wonders of Alaska," which contained many graphic descriptions of the Northern Territory and was replete with valuable historical data.

SCHOOL BOARD MATTERS.

Danger to Buildings Arising from Sooty Coal Discussed—Miscellaneous Items.

The board of education met last night, but before proceeding to the transaction of regular business, discussed informally and at considerable length, the danger to school buildings from the use of sooty coal. Superintendent of Buildings Flannery recommended as a remedy for the present, that steam pipes be placed in the smoke stacks for drawing out the soot. The probability is that the recommendation will be adopted.

President Badam presided at the meeting and all the members were present except Critchlow and Cotton. The first business to be transacted was the approval of Treasurer Flannery's report, the amount of which is \$10,000. The members are: WILLIAM A. HANNAH, \$10,000; J. E. HANNAH, \$10,000; W. W. HILL, \$10,000; and CHARLES H. BUTLER, \$10,000.

The committee on buildings and ground presented a report that it had examined the carpenter work in the Webster school building and found it to be of good quality and in accordance with the specifications. The committee also reported that the school building was in good condition and that the school was in good condition.

This resolution was adopted on recommendation of the committee on teachers and school work: "That the superintendent of schools be authorized to employ teachers and to supply the rooms of as many teachers as are available, while they are permitted to work in the schools, provided that the authority for the employment of teachers be limited and not to exceed thirty days for the remaining portion of the school year."
