Last night, at the celebration of Channeccab-the feast of lights-the congregation of B'nai Israel listened to the first sermon of Rabbi Charles Freund, who has just come to take charge of the congregation. The sermon was an eloquent one, and was listened to with great attention. At its close many of the congregation remained to meet their new rabbi.

He said in part: "Over 2,000 years ago the temple in Jerusalem was rededicated. The defilements of a hostile for were removed and in their place the purer worship of God was reinstated. Supreme Court Holds Mrs. Real Eati tled to \$70 a Month.

In the case of Lits Read against Charles Read, appellant, the supreme court has handed down an opinion affirming the judgment of the lower court. Mrs. Read was granted a di-vorce from appellant and was award-ed \$70 per month alimony. The appeal was taken from the order awarding alimony, appellant claiming that the amount was excessive. Justice Mc Carty, who wrote the opinion of th supreme court, holds that the amoun is liberal, but not excessive in view o the fact that Mr. Read earns from \$25 to \$300 per month, and owns a hom valued at \$16,000.

In the opinion of the supreme court, written by Chief Justice Baskin, this judgment is affirmed for the reason that there was no repudiation of the contract of sale by either party to the action and further that time was not the essence of the agreement, hence an action for eject-ment for failure to pay an installment of the purchase price would not lie.
