Deceased was born in the parish of Bishop Froome, Herefordshire, England, embraced the gospel under the hands of Elder Wilford Woodruff at Castle Froome, of said county on March 7th, 1840, and emigrated with her husband in the fall of said year for the beautiful city of Nauvoo; shared the trials and privations incident to the exodus of the Saints in 1846, and settled at Winter Quarters on the Missouri River, at which place they remained till the following year, when they joined Bishop Edward Hunter's company, traveling the plains under the captaincy of Joseph Horne, and following on the track of the Pioneers, arriving in Salt Lake Valley in the early part of October, 1847. Sister Betsy Holmes was favorably known to a host of Saints, passing through poverty and trial without a murmur, true to her partner, true to her brethren and sisters, and true to her God. She died as she had lived in the full faith of a glorious resurrection to eternal life.

At Bloomington, Bear Lake County, Idaho, February, 16th, 1882, of diphtheria, MELVIN ALPHONZO, the beloved son of Journal and Orleans Palmer; aged 3 years, 9 months and 25 days.

## OBITUARY.

Mrs. MARY ANN LEAVER, relict of the late Samuel Leaver, who died at her residence in the Eighth Ward, this city, on Tuesday, April 4th, at 2 p. m., of apoplexy, was born in Barnberry, Oxfordshire, England, June 21st, 1810. She emigrated to the United States in the year 1834, and heard the first Gospel sermon preached in New York City in 1840. On April 30th, 1842, She became identified with the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints by baptism. Elder L. R. Foster administered the sacred ordinance. In November, 1845, with her husband, who joined the Church the same year she did, and small family of children, she reached Nauvoo, Ill., and thence was driven with the Saints from their homes, sojourning briefly at Kaneville, Iowa, and "Winter Quarters," now Nebraska; they reached this city in the year 1852. Sister Leaver lived in the 8th Ward from the time of her arrival until her

demise, and was always known and esteemed as one of the noblest, kindest and purest of her sex. She was President of the 8th Ward Relief Society from its organization until her demise, and was ever deeply interested in the welfare of the dependent on that excellent organization for relief. At her death she was surrounded by all her family of children, two sons and three daughters, and a number of her grand-children, all of whom with a circle of friends, will deeply feel her loss. Ripe in years, in good, faithful and patient works, she has gone to her rest to await the morning of the first resurrection. Her funeral took place at the 8th Ward Assembly Rooms to-day at 12:30 p. m.

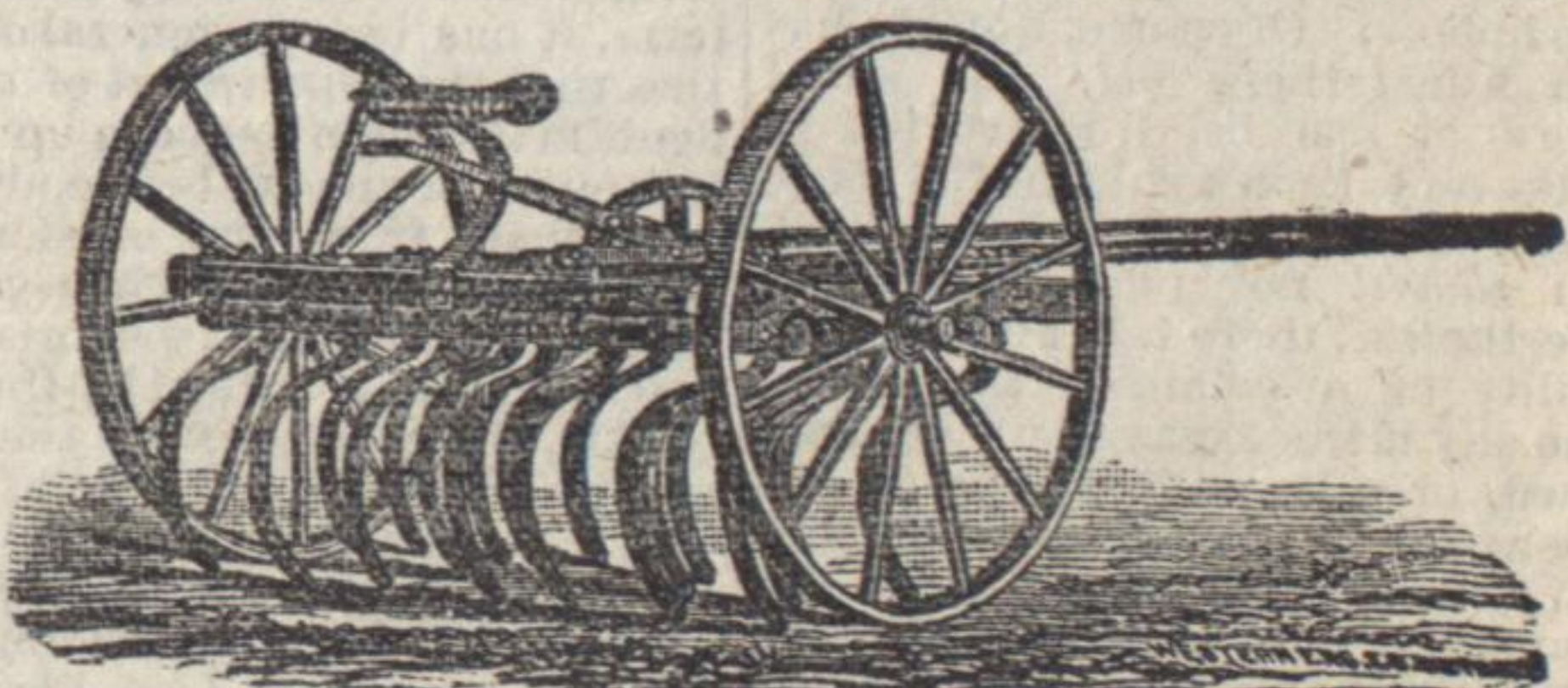
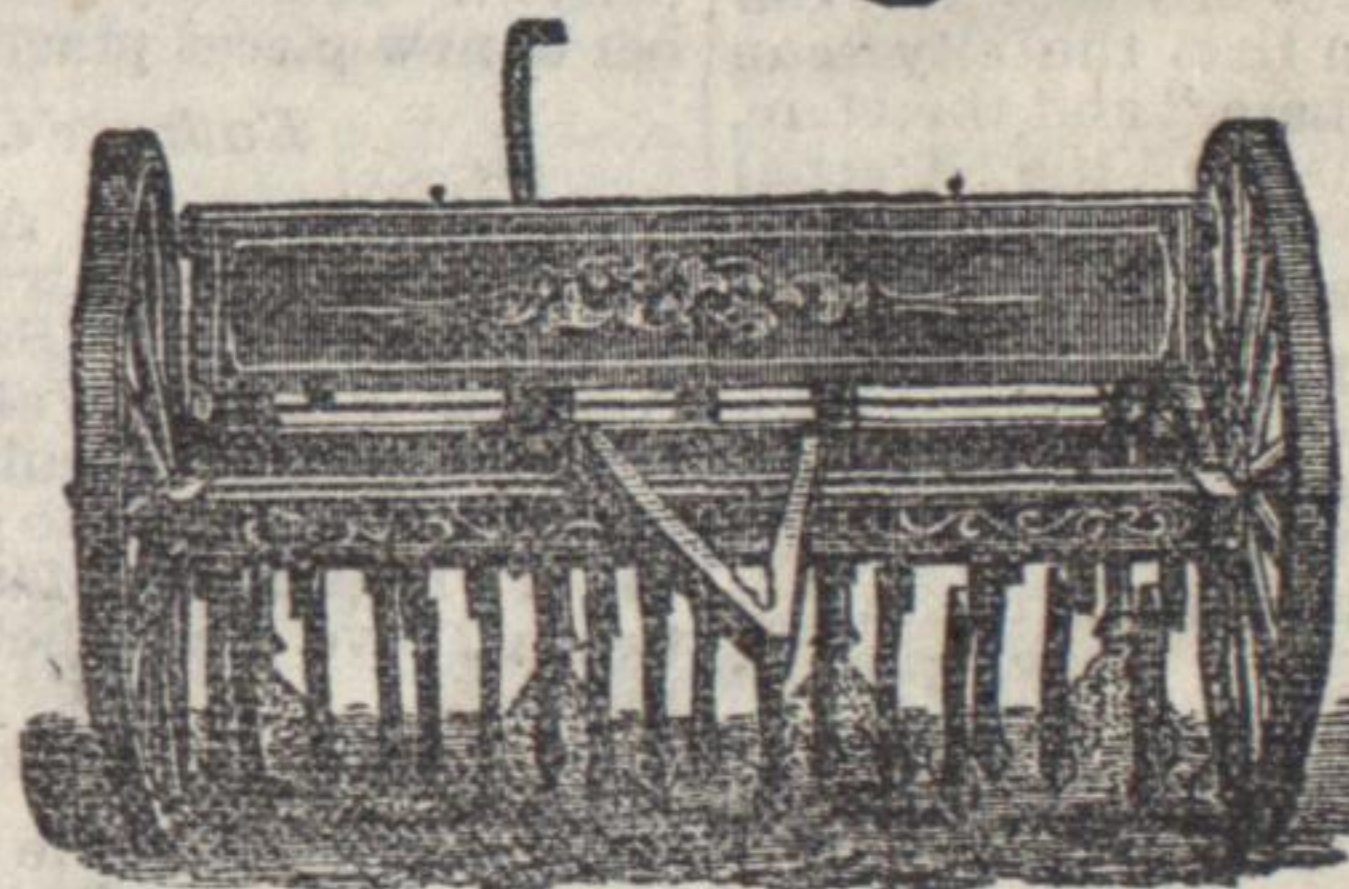
