CONGRESSIONAL.

SENATE. Variety of Bills. The Vice President submitted resolutions from the S. C. Legislature, asking the recognition of Cuban belligerency. Anthony presented a report from the committee on printing, relating to the printing of 20,000 copies of the report of the Commissioners of Agriculture.

HOUSE.

Bills for Reconstruction, etc., etc. (Shanks introduced a bill to perfect the reconstruction committee. Stevenson introduced a bill to place on the free list the following articles: tea, coffee, molasses, syrup or cane juice, rice, salt, lumber, hides, staves, printing paper, and iron in pigs. Stevenson also introduced a bill to provide for the settlement of conflicting claims to patent rights.

FOREIGN NEWS.

GREAT BRITAIN. Ecclesiastical. LONDON, 9.—Letters from Rome assert that the majority of the French Bishops, including Dupanloup, and many of the German Bishops, will oppose the declaration of the dogma of Papal infallibility. FRANCE. How in the Corps Legislatif. In the Corps Legislatif, to-day, M. Rochefort replied with bitterness to the speech of Forcade. He made offensive allusions to the Emperor, which caused great disorder in the Chamber, and were received with a storm of dissent by a majority of the members.

HAVANA.

Excitement over the Message. HAVANA.—President Grant's Message has caused intense excitement among sympathizers with the revolution, who are disappointed. The Spaniards are satisfied and regard the Message as the harbinger of peace and prosperity to the island.

CANADA.

News from Red River. OTTAWA.—Donald G. Smith, who arrived here a few days ago, has received a cable dispatch from the Hudson Bay Company to proceed at once to Red River to assist Governor McTavish in the administration of the Territory, or to succeed him in case of his demise. A dispatch received by the government from McDonald and Gov. McTavish represents that the difficulty in the Territory was subsiding. Governor McDougall will enter the Territory as soon as the Queen's proclamation reaches him; the authority of the Dominion government in the Territory will be at once announced by him in a proclamation, dated Fort Garry. The executive council will meet at once and every responsible representative from the half-breed population will receive the earliest attention of the government of the Territory.
