"These stores were left by me in 1881 when retreating southward. In 1893 when Peary went north during the winter from his ship, then winte i g at tape burville, he was hadly fr zon and was obliged to seek shelter at p-old quaretre in Discovery hay. He then heat eight twee and was saved from death by the stores then found by him in good condition. "T think it was more than two months before he was able to return to his ship. There were left at Conger all the books, clothing and other per-sonal belongings of 25 men. Almost anything might be found, as we took with us only our scientific records, durines and the clothing which we ware, with 19 pounds of selected personal property for each man."
