fever:--Take sheep's drawns (melts), cut six gashes each way on the smooth side thereof, apply the smooth and gashed side of a melt to the sole of each foot, keep the melts on twenty-four hours if the perfume arising therefrom be not too bad; have other melts so prepared and ready to replace the first. Forty-eight hours' application is usually sufficient. Then wash well with warm water. In cases of brain fever, take bullock's melts, gashed in the same way, and wmp around the head.
