

# Trapped Wild Animals Shot by the Camera at Short Range.



THE accompanying striking pictures of mountain lions, bears, deer and other wild animals were secured by Miss Elizabeth H. Cannon, 31 south First West, Salt Lake, on a recent trip to Mexico. Miss Cannon is loaning the pictures to the Deseret News for half-ton reproduction. The pictures are as follows:

The Mexicans live in deadly fear of the Apache Indians that haunt the Sierra Madre. They keep to the tableland and do not disturb the mountain fastnesses. So the virgin hills have retained all their pristine luxuriance and abundance of wild game with the result that they are today the best hunting grounds in America.

The flats are covered with mesquite, the haunt of jack-rabbits and cottontails, while the desert claims the cactus and the oase which shelters the rattlesnake. A little higher up, the hills are covered with the maguay or century plant, while the mountains are covered with the mangarita and the oak, full of the gorgeous plumaged birds of the tropics varying from blue birds to chattering parakeets. There also is the pinon pine and squawberry bush. The streams are lined with cottonwoods hung with festoons of mistletoe, while in the deeper canyons the mighty pine rears its head, the wild grape vine and the poison ivy cling to the wild cherry trees and the dainty columbine rears

its dainty head among the ferns. Here on the sands the wild turkey leaves its track. "Not so the mountain lion which hides its cat-like body so successfully that its presence is only known by its deadly blow. This is the terrible menace to American cattle ranchers as the catamount has a decided predilection for veal. Some were strangled and a few were trapped, but with little result. The most effective way of hunting them is with French hounds that scent them down. But the wily cat does not always stop with the coyotes. A man and boy while passing through the Arroyo Sacho (dry ravine) stopped and loomed the horses for the night. They built a great fire that illumined the high walls of the canyon, out of some alcoholic plants for protection. Towards morning the father sent his son out to get the horses. Some time elapsed and he had not returned. The man arose and went in search. He found the boy with a lion at his entrails.

"The gray wolf is perhaps most feared because this dauntless beast hunts in packs. Then, too, sometimes, like the coyote, he goes mad with hydrophobia, and woe to the thing-man or beast—that he bites. "Deer hunting is best on moonlight nights when the animals graze. When the nights are dark hunters wait till early morning, and it is a case of the early rider getting the stag. The gentle antelope run in herds over the prairie, and a man on a swift horse

has a better chance of getting them. "Quail are plentiful and the little rancher with his gun along, who has ridden out to look after some cattle, returns with his saddle-bag bulged out with the delicious little birds. Fool hens, a little larger than the quail, but quite as good eating—are more elusive. They come close, but are hard to hit. Cowboys say that after you have emptied your carbines on one, you might throw your pistol, (like Buffalo Bill, when he went down to the river to bathe) and kill it. "The great shaggy black bear and the brown cinnamon are trapped almost exclusively. Some men, traveling through the mountains had exhausted their ammunition. The guide,

on turning around a gray boulder was confronted by a large bear which stood on her hind legs and extended her arms. The man let a whoop, and then promptly stumbled over a rock which tripped him backwards so that his heels went up squarely in Mrs. Bruhn's face. She turned and fled and when the other hunters came up they found the two whimpering cubs of the renegade mother, in a tree. They throw their lariats over the brown babies' heads, lassening their cowboy fashion, and pulled them down. They took them down to one of the settlements where Jack and Jill proved a continual circus for the children. However the "Teddy bears" weak diet of cow's milk was of insufficient sustenance, and they died. Suffice it to say that there were some sincere and loud-moaning mourners at their funeral.
