FINANCES OF WEBER COUNTY

County Clerk's Statement Shows Indebtedness of \$160,854.18; Various Assets, \$186,800.11.

NAME WATER COMMISSIONERS

State Senator Bamberger Asks for Franchise for Salt Lake and Ogden Railway.

Ogden, July 21.—The county commissioners at their regular meeting received delegations representing the Wilson, Warren, Hooper, Plain City, Marshall, Harrisville, North Ogden and Fair West irrigation companies, who appeared to urge the appointment of water commissioners to look after the distribution of the waters of the Ogden and Weber rivers to the various irrigators throughout Weber county.

At the meeting of the board a week ago the petition of some of the companies for water commissioners was tabled, but it was evident that some difficulties were going to arise if someone was not appointed to distribute the waters, hence the irrigation companies appointed their delegates who thoroughly discussed the situation before the board and convinced them of the need of the appointments, which were made. Frank W. Stratford was appointed water commissioner for the Weber river and Joseph A. Taylor for the Ogden river. After these gentlemen have distributed the water to the various canal companies, everybody residing in the district must abide by the same and in no way interfere with the headgates, otherwise they will be punished to the fullest extent of the law. Some irrigators have always caused trouble, never being satisfied with the distribution of the water, but all of the companies represented at the meeting yesterday, are united on the proposition that if any person is found tampering with the headgates or irrigating ditches they will have him prosecuted. The crops in Weber county up to the present time are the best seen here for many years, and the prospects for an abundant harvest of all kinds of grains, fruits, vegetables, and especially sugar beets are unusually bright. The spring and early summer rains gave the crops a good start, which with careful irrigating during this extremely hot weather, will bring abundant returns.

COUNTY FINANCES. A statement of all property owned by Weber county and the approximate value thereof, also the bonded and floating debt of the county, has been prepared by County Clerk Mattson, as required by statute, and submitted to the board of county commissioners, who have ordered the same filed. Simon Bamberger, president of the Salt Lake and Ogden Railway company, made application to the board of county commissioners for a franchise to construct his railroad line through Weber county. Mr. Bamberger, Director A. T. Wright and Attorney Hollingsworth appeared before the board and presented a franchise ordinance, which was read and passed. The gentlemen also presented a proposition to make a slight change in the county road near Riverdale, so as to make the line of the proposed railroad into Ogden much better. Some of the property owners in the district affected have expressed a willingness for the change, and on Thursday the county commissioners, county attorney, representatives of the company and their engineer will inspect the proposed

change, and if it is found to be advantageous to all concerned the commissioners will call for a vote of the freeholders in the district to decide the proposition.

The commissioners have appointed as delegates from Weber county to the National irrigation congress to be held at Boise, Idaho, in September, Joseph Stanford, Preston Blair, William G. Wilson, C. A. Christensen and Oscar B. Malcom.
