It is repeating itself; rainy and damp weather greeted the Conference of fair crowds arriving in the city from outside towns last evening and this morning. The rain does not seem to be dampening the spirits of the pleasure-seekers a whit, as the early ones were filled. Among these may be mentioned large cabinets and cases from the wood shop, the carriage shop, tool, carpentry implements, and all shapes and sizes of woodwork. The cabinets and cases are filled with beautiful dresses and sewing pieces from the needle classes. Jams, jellies, cakes, bread and other contributions from the domestic science classes have no small share of the space. All in all the Agricultural college is well represented at the fair.
