

IN SOUTHERN UTAH.

Mines and Mining Developments in That Part of the State.

WORK IN STATE LINE DISTRICT.
Operations at Silver Bee, Pinto and De Lano—Trading on Manganese—Park City Holdings.

Notwithstanding the fact that almost every newspaper talk has been indulged in regarding the new State Line mining district, the conditions in that locality are such as to warrant the statement that before long still more attention will be given to the district, both through the medium of the press and also through the interest that will undoubtedly be shown among capitalists and wealthy speculating syndicates.

Mr. E. G. Wooley Jr., who has just returned from a ten days' trip around and through southern Utah, gives it as his opinion that many of the locations being worked there at present will, in a short time, be abandoned, as they are now to worthless and well-known mines.

In the town of Salt Lake there are now from 150 to 200 men, most of whom are engaged in working and developing the claims in the new district.

It is the desire of the United States government to establish a post office in the vicinity and are likewise asking for the establishment of a telegraph line to the camp, and are also asking for a school house. Silver Bee is a parameter house with them and several times now they showed their love for the gold-hugs by turning them over to the officials.

There is a great activity in the camp at present and the properties that are being developed are mainly owned by the men working them. The Ophir and Burn mines are making regular shipments to the smelters, and the miners are receiving wages which range from \$1,000 per ton in silver and \$10 to \$12 in gold, while the latter producers are running from \$200 to \$300 in gold and silver. The miners from the new district are finding the gold to be beautiful colors and is freely panished, showing that it will be very easily worked. The silver is generally found in a sulphide state and is being sent to the smelters in a metallic form.

Nowhere in Utah, or which side nearly all the developmental work is being done, are there better facilities for rock mining. The miners found there plan to make the kind of mine that is to exist for the extraction of gold and for the purposes of fuel. Water of the purest mountain variety is easily obtained, coming down from the canyon roofs. It is said that a jumbo of a 10-foot wall will make up against the storage through the regular channels. It is estimated that the district will supply sufficient water to the miners for two years, and that is the length that is necessary for ordinary purposes. The Utah and Nevada state line cuts the district at Government Peak, three miles west of Hatherell.

At Hatherell, the old time mining districts of Southern Utah, the Hatherell and Walker mills are in operation, turning five stamps by means of water, having a capacity of 100 tons per hour. Water is taken from the water works of the Terrian, Thompson and others by cylinders. The water in the properties of the district are so high that it is necessary to pump the water out of the California shafts. The men work, however, are taking out good ore, and when a ton in silver comes, the necessary pumping machinery is kept the properties in good condition.

The miners in the new district have hardly been organized, comparatively speaking, and although a small amount of ore has been extracted from them, there
