FRAGMENTS.

The Salt Lake has shown up strongly in its defense of the trial.

Very civil and impartial cases for trial at the present term of the Third district court are more than usually numerous.

An estimated sum has provided around the Dredge building today. It was a short time ago that most extensive of a large crowd.

The February term of the Third district was opened this morning and a big rush of legal business has been had since that time.

Cyrus J. Draper delivered his first charge to the grand jury of the Third circuit court this morning. It was a short one, and so far as I can learn all went well.

The father of George Taylor, Harry Hammond's attorney, was arrested this morning. He is deeply involved now in the outcome of his son's trial, which will begin in earnest tomorrow and probably will take a hand in the outcome with Moore, Whittemore and Watson.

The Chinese new year is now on, and the holiday will be observed by the local Mongolians for some time to come. They will be engaged in the discharge of a variety of ceremonial acts mostly by the temples themselves. Feasting and "lai see" will be the order until the new year comes.

John Blackman, a dangerous and profligate character, released from jail yesterday evening in the charge of using abusive language and making threats of violence.
