TWO BILLS DRAWN.

The Anti-Silver Measure Provides for Unconditional Bipartisanship.

A STRONG FREE COINAGE BILL.

The Question of Priority of Consideration Remains to be Determined.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 10.—The two bills on silver are to be left at discretion of the financial question. They were fully prepared and are ready for presentation. The one drawn by the anti-silver men is brief and to the point. It largely provides for the unconditional repeal of much of the act of July 14, 1890, as drawn the monthly practice of half a cent and five-cent coinage and the setting of the toning of the treasury notes.

The measure drawn by the free coinage people is longer and is spoken to a number of points, dealing with the greatest possible extension of the free coinage system. The first bill provides that all the quarters or parts of cents of silver bullion standard weight shall be entitled to have the same value in silver dollars at the mint of the United States. The dollar is to be coined in silver, gold, and copper and bronze, and any kind of silver dollars may, at his discretion, except the sum in the United States treasury and receive silver coinage.

The bill drawn by the free coinage men is regarded as the strongest measure that could be possibly presented by the silver men, the question of ratio being left to the discretion of the committee.

The great question still to be determined is which of the two bills is to have priority of consideration. The silver men say that it is the responsibility of the silver men to present the bill first. The anti-silver men say that they will accept either bill.

THE SILVER QUESTION.

A BRIEFED Proposition by English Bankers.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 10.—A new phase of the silver question was presented today in the shape of an apparently authorized proposition from London bankers, headed by the English government of Lord Rosebery, on which it was announced that the United States would make the present Sherman law on the same basis. England would renew the free coinage of silver in India at a rate of 100 to 100, and that a committee consisting of Mr. A. M. and Mr. G. H. Johnson, chairman and vice-chairman, would be appointed under arms, charged with sending the bill to the House of Commons.

Mr. Johnson, chairman, said:

"We demand that the bill be introduced at once."

Crop Reports.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 10.—The August report of the statistics of the production of agricultural shows that the committee on agriculture has a little over six points during the past month, the average of the entire country being 87, against 81.2 for July. The decline is due to the drought, which has proven extensive and persistent.

The average in the principal states are Illinois, 81; Iowa, 80; Kansas, 82; Nebraska, 85.

There has been considerable falling in the condition of spring wheat since the beginning of the month, somewhat over ten points, the average of the present month being 82, as against 77.4 for the month of July. The condition of oats is as follows: Michigan, 79; Iowa, 87; Nebraska, 80; South Dakota, 85.

THE COTTON AND BARLEY.
