BINGHAM MINES OF BINGHAM CON

The Past Year Has Been One of **Great Activity at These** Big Properties.

MASCOTTE TUNNEL.

Has Cut Three Great Ledges Which Company's Locations Cover-Commercial Ore Reserves.

The past year at the mines of the Bingham Consolidated Mining company has been an active one, and the new 1906 will dawn under bright skies. At the Dalton & Lark mines, which consist of the Dalton & Lark, Miner's Dream, Antelope, Yosemite No. 1, Brooklyn and Sampson mines, com-prising in all about 400 acres, the campaign has been particularly vigorous. paign has been particularly vigorous. These properties cover three distinct veins along the strike for a distance of approximately 7,000 feet.

During the year 1905 the Mascotte tunnel has cut all of these veins. The Lark vein has over 1,000 feet of development work on this local. 700 feet

opment work on this level, 700 feet westerly from the Intersection of the tunnel and the vein, and 300 feet east-erly. These drives east and west are in ore their entire length. A large ton-nage of lead has been opened on the east side, while to the west the values run largely in copper.
From a point on this level connection

was made on the Lark vein with the upper workings of the mine by a vertical raise to the 1,250- foot level, thence to the 1,070-foot level, by an inclined winze, equipped with a gravity skip.
All ores now mined from the upper levels are dropped to the 1,070 and 1,100foot levels, and from there, loaded into a skip and dropped into a chute on the Mascotte tunnel level, from which point all the ores are transported to the railroad ore bins through the Mascotte tunnel, a distance of 8,200 feet; a five-ton electric motor being utilized for this purpose, making a round trip from loading station in the mines every 30 minutes. All ores mined are moved

to the surface in this manner. Connection is also made from the Mascotte tunnel levels by a continuation of the inclined winze and gravity skip down to a large lead stope, which has been developed on the tunnel level to the east of the intersection of the Mascotte tunnel, thus affording two in-dependent thoroughfares for dropping ore into the Mascotte tunnel bins. No hoisting or pumping has been done on this property for some time past, but a shaft is maintained which connects with all of the workings, and is kept in commission for the purpose of lowering timber, toos, etc.

HAVE PRODUCED HEAVILY.

These combined properties have been ore daily for the past year, the product being shipped to the company's smelter, located on the Rio Grande Western railway at West Jordan, Utah, via a branch line from Revere station on that company's branch to Bingham. produced daily which is shipped to the smelter of the American Smelting & Refining company at Murray, Utah. The Dalton & Lark properties are thoroughly equipped with approved machinery and appliances for the economical mining and transportation of the product of the company's vast ore reserves. The company generates its own steam and electric power.

ORE RESERVES DOUBLED. The Commercial mine, another of the Bingham Con.'s Bingham properties, is situated in the upper portion of the Bingham camp and has been producing copper ore at the rate of 250 tons per day for the entire year, the product being shipped via the Copper Belt rail-road from the mine to Bingham station, thence via the Rio Grande Western rallway to the company's smelter at West Jordan, Utah.

During the season important develop-ments have been made on the lower

ments have been made on the lower tunnel, and two new ore bodies have been opened up in virgin ground, which have practically doubled the ore reserves of this property.

The method pursued in mining the ore is known as the "North of England," or caving system of mining, which affords a very low mining cost. The lower tunnel connects with the loading station of the Copper Belt railroad, the upper tunnel being connected with the lower tunnel by means of a gravity road optunnel by means of a gravity road op-erated with skips running in balance. The mine has its own power plant and generates its own steam and air
