PETITION IN BANKRUPTCY.

Nathan Tanner, Jr., an Attorney. Petitions for Relief from His Debts.

Liabilities \$9,745,35; Assets \$3,314,50, all Exempt—District Court—School Funds.

Nathan Tanner Jr., one of Ogden's members of the bar, has filed an application in the United States circuit court to be adjudged a voluntary bankrupt. Judge Marshall being absent from the city before Maloney has taken the matter in hand. The hearing on the petition is set for November 28th, and the meeting of creditors is set for December 4, 1899.
