Annual Family Gathering Held in this City Sunday.

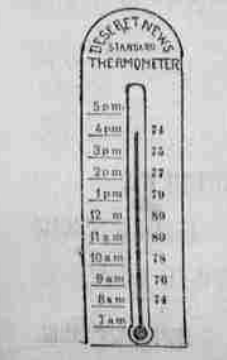

Ella Amick filed a suit for divorce in the Tenth district court today against her husband, Robert Amick, a blacksmith. The parties were intermarried in this city on the 12th of February, 1889. The complaint alleges that Amick has been guilty of habitual drunkenness, and for more than a year past has failed to provide for his wife. There are four children of the house living. Plaintiff also alleges that she and her children have been dependent upon her parents for support. It is alleged that defendant has been guilty of grossly neglecting the household goods and that she has given the custody of the children and such other relief as the court may see just and equitable. Ray Van Cott is Mrs. Amick's attorney.

THE LIBERTY PARK ASSAIL.

The trial of Frank Campbell, who is charged with attempting to assassinate the same, continued at 10 o'clock in the hall of Justice, commencing before a jury in Judge Norrie's court today. A number of witnesses were examined which went to show the defendant's actions were wilful. J. S. Malin, Oregon West and Police Officer Heath testified in seeing the defendant in company with the girls on the day named, and from what was witnessed Officer Heath placed the defendant under arrest. Clara Carey, sister of the complaining witness, said she was twelve years old. She had known the defendant four years. FISH IN BEAR LAKE.

Five specimens of Whitefish and Moon-eyed Bullhead taken in Bear Lake.

SALT LAKE CITY, June 15, 1897.

One year ago last March I planned in Bear Lake three millions white fish fry near Charlie. The eggs came from Lake Erie and were hatched out at Montpelier, Idaho. I have just received by express six baby white fish weighing from eight ounces to one pound each, fat and juicy within. This shows a phenomenal growth and that the conditions for their multiplication and development in the Bear Lake waters are certainly very good and abundant and no doubt all that could be expected. The next letter will show the great importance of the magnificent plant when this lot of white fish are hatched on the tables of the people generally. I trust at a normal rate. No doubt the plant of two million white fish fry to grow in Lake Erie in one year and last, will show up to go as large as some of the fish in the Bear Lake water. With the white fish there came about one million moon-eyed Bullheads, which averaged about one pound each. This is also a very good fish and in prime condition being very fat and sweet. In fact of those in the white fish and black fish are also very good. The white fish and moon-eyed Bullheads can be seen at the Bear Lake and Oyster market, corner of Main and First streets.
