NEW YORK.

The Celebration.

New York, 5.—The glorious Fourth

seems to have been celebrated with un-

usual enthusiasm throughout the

country. Business was generally sus-

pended in all the larger cities. National

salutes were fired at all the military

posts, and in most of the principal

cities there were processions, music,

orations and fireworks as in this city.

An inhuman monster commits a most

barbaric murder—A Meloe at the Cele-

bration.

AURORA, 5.—A most dastardly mur-

der was committed in De Kalb Co.,

three miles from Stabionas Grove vil-

lage, last evening. Miss Joan McCorn-

ick, a beautiful young lady of seven-

teen, the eldest daughter of a wealthy

farmer's widow, was deliberately shot

and instantly killed, while sitting at

the supper-table with her mother, two

younger sisters and her brother, by a

gracious farm-hand named John Reed;

the only pretext being that she refused

to accompany him to the 4th of July

celebration. Reed fired two shots

from the window from a double

barreled shotgun, the first charge

entering her brain and killing her in-

stantly; the second passing over the

head of a sister sitting in range, and

lodging in the ceiling. He returned

the gun to a neighbor from whom he

had borrowed it, and fled. The excite-

ment was so great that not a person for

miles around slept that night. Forty

men on horseback scoured the country,

and messengers were dispatched to var-

ious railroad stations, some going to

Aurora and Chicago, to intercept his

flight. Reed is about twenty-three

years of age, of medium height, spare

build, full face, short curly hair, and a

hang-dog look. He worked two years

for the mother of the murdered young

lady previous to this season. After the

inquest it was learned that he had told

a boy that afternoon he was going to

shoot her, because she would not go

with him. There is not a citizen of that

town but would assist in lynching him

if found.

CHICAGO, 5.—The Fourth was cele-

brated here with the usual carnival

and noise. The only occurrence of im-

portance that took place was in con-

nection with the military parade and

review at Wright's Grove, where there

was a quarrel between soldiers and citi-

zens who mounted an adjoining fence to

view the spectacle. It ripened into a

melee in which several persons were

injured by bayonet stabs and sabre

cuts, but none fatally. The disturbance
