TANNERIES AND TANNING.

SALT LAKE CITY, January 19, 1879.

Editors Deseret News:

I wish to give a few of my ideas to the readers of your paper, on the subject of tanning, and the subject of construction and working of tanneries. My object is to call out communications from others, and to benefit those who may want to engage in that branch of home industry and have not the practical knowledge.

The tanners and curriers of Utah have always been very reticent on this subject. I cannot say any good reason for this. The information from others does not detract from our trade, and may be of great benefit to those who receive it. The time has been in Utah, when tanning has been carried on profitably in tanneries of half a dozen vats, and all the work done by hand or horse power.

Circumstances are different now from what they were 30 years ago. The tanners of to-day must compete in price and quality with the imported leather. In order to do so, the tanneries must be built on a labor-saving principle, have machinery to facilitate the work, and save expense. A tannery of less than 50 vats, and the required number of horse-power, will not pay to equip with machinery now in use. If one settlement is not able to build one of this capacity, and get the machinery, then one or more counties should join as a co-operative or stock company. Each settlement could have its shoe and harness shop, and get the leather from the tannery. A pecuniary interest would be created throughout the district that co-operated in the enterprise, and the people will give it their patronage.

Grinding bark, breaking bladders, pumping of the liquor and handling and stuffing the leather, and all the work that steam or water power can be applied to, should be done in that way. It is essential that a skilled workman have control of the work. There are but few good tanners and curriers in Utah, and

every establishment should have one or more apprentices.

Workmen cannot be made too soon to meet the demand. In an experience of 30 years, I have seen many failures, and much material wasted through the incompetency of the workmen on the one hand, and the want of the inexperienced to entertain the idea that skilled labor is not necessary in the beamhouse or tannery. They are ignorant of the fact that the foundation of good leather is laid in the work done in the beamhouse. Experienced workmen are as much required in the process of tanning, bluing, bating and tanning, as in the finishing, and no currier can make good leather out of stock badly handled in the beamhouse and tannery.

It is not my intention to give in detail the construction and arrangement of tanneries. The same plan will not suit in every particular all locations. It is supposed that the experienced who contemplate building tanneries will apply to those who are conversant with the subject and have the ability. Tanneries should be located as near the bark as is practicable. The transportation of hides and other material to the tannery will cost much less than to haul the bark the same distance. I am confident, if strict attention is given to the subjects I have named, and good workmen have the management, the manufacture of leather will not be a failure in Utah, but a good percentage will be made in the investment.
