They are made of the toughest Oak, Ash and Hickory that the forests of Ohio, Michigan and Wisconsin can furnish.

This timber is thoroughly seasoned, being kept from three to five years in open sheds. The hubs are then subjected to a degree of heat sufficient to make them perfectly dry, without injury to the wood.

The hubs are of Black Locust, and warranted not to check.

The spokes are soaked in boiling oil before being painted, and will not shrink.

The entire wood work of these Wagons is seasoned, so as to stand the severest test of this peculiarly dry climate.

They have a clip around front Axle for the bound brace, and stay-chains instead of a ball through axle.

The frame is constructed with the same double-headed California Havel, On all padding and heavy Wagon (with extra axles) or the manufacturers for the year in the United States and every Wagon we sell is guaranteed to last at least ten years.

They are the best proportioned and best ironed Wagon that ever crossed the Missouri River.

We challenge comparison on each of these points.

The bottom of the floor has double cleats in the centre secured by double straps that run over the top, instead of being simply a board nailed to the sides of the box.

We use a Patent Reliable Chain of our own make, set by a Patent Axle Gauge, which secures us the Patent Best Round on the smaller sizes.

We have no rivets in the axle-tree, and the axle-tree is made of the finest material.

We give the most satisfactory guarantee that our customers can desire.

We have an improvement by which they can be used without the box being on the Wagon. We have entered a patent for this purpose.

The bolsters are of iron plate, and there are corresponding plates on the edges of the box. They have our Patent Bolster for King Bolt (found on no other wagon), which leaves a smooth surface for the bottom of the box, and prevents the King Bolt from wearing into the bolster.

We give the following warranty with each wagon:

"We warrant the Wagon No. 10,000, or any machine we may hereafter put out, to be of good seasoned timber, and well made, and to carry a load of 10,000 lbs. without breaking down, either in material or workmanship. We agree to make good without cost to the purchaser."
