THIRD LOCOMOTIVE. The third electric locomotive of the Utah Light & Railway company has just been turned out of the shops, and is now being tested, hauling heavy loads for ballasting. It is the 3d, and is a duplicate of the 2d. There is a large amount of this ballasting to be done where new track has been laid, as in the Waterloo and Third Avenue lines, so that the engines are kept busy hauling gravel, which is put under the ties, ensuring a stable roadbed in wet weather. The company's new engine of the company will shortly be put on the State prison and Wanders line, which will have to be rebuilt. Care is running now on the new north track of the Third Avenue line, thus relieving the collection occasioned by the use of but one track. The relief the new tracks give from the heavy packing experience of the light rail is very marked.

## BOTH SIDES WANT STREET CAR LINE

Lively Tilt in Council Last Night Between Tenth and Eleventh Easters.

FATHERS TO GO OVER ROUTE. People Desiring Change Made Represented by Jos. Lippman, While A. B. Elder Appears for Protestants.

A lively little tilt between Joseph Lippman and A. B. Elder, representing protestants on Tenth East street and Eleventh East street, is just a forerunner of what may be expected when the two portions of the eastern bench section of town come together Wednesday afternoon next, when the council goes over their ground to see who needs the street car system the worse. Until such time as the protestants submit their case and leave the matter in the hands of the council, there is bound to be a vigorous fight waged on both sides.

SIDE OF ELEVENTH EASTERS. The tilt last night was started when the committee of the whole met in the council chamber to take up the new franchise asked by the Utah Light & Railway company. Protestants from Eleventh East street were out in force. The Eleventh East petitioners, headed by A. B. Elder, were very numerous. These petitioners want the present route Douglas has recanted so that it shall maintain its eastward course until Eleventh East street is reached and then taking its route southerly to the city center. In explanation of their demands, the people declare that the advantages are all for that scheme. They point out that the hill is more gradual and that the brewery hill, over which the line is now routed is so precipitous that danger lurks there every time a car rounds the curve. This they claim might result in danger to the children and other passengers using the line. They admit that there never has been an accident on the curve, but point that there might be one some day. Then they say that there are more people to be benefited by the proposed change in the routing of the car.

TENTH EAST PROTESTANTS. Every point raised by Mr. Elder in support of his petition was resisted by Mr. Lippman for the Tenth East protestants. He also argued to the council's committee that the people along Tenth East street have improved the street with the idea of fitting it to a street car line, that they have improved their property, believing that the line was going to remain there and that their property would be depreciated if the change in route should be made.

REFERRED TO ENGINEER. After the argument had proceeded for some time and the attorneys for the two sides became somewhat ardent in their protestations, Mr. O'Donnell moved that the entire matter be referred to the city engineer for his report and investigation. This was assented to by Mr. Mulvey, who included the council in the motion. Mr. O'Donnell further announced by providing for a trip of inspection over the ground next Wednesday afternoon at 2 o'clock. The members of the council to meet at the Hotel Utah for an inspection of the ground. The trip was extended to protestants from both sides to be present to go over the proposed new routing and the old routing and to see the advantages of their individual proposals.

"UNTIL AFTER ELECTION." With this action, the disposition of the railway company's franchise came to a standstill. The inspection trip and the consideration of protests will serve the council to while away the time until "after election," when they will probably grant everything the company is asking.
