In 1845 a great change took place in the atmosphere of the Arctic regions. On the 2nd day of September, in that year, the volcanoes of Hecla were aroused from a slumber of fifty-eight years. For near two years immediately preceding this convulsion, the climate of Iceland has been of an unusual mildness for that latitude. This eruption of Hecla was attended by a lightning and thunder storm of fearful magnitude; the sheets of lightning and peals of thunder were incessant; blazing meteors filled the air, and the aurora illuminated the whole northern border every night, for months. The eruptions continued at intervals until January 15th, 1847. In August, 1846, the flames from Hecla reached the enormous altitude of 16,000 feet, and in the month of January following, the ashes from its volcano were thrown out in such abundance, and to such a height as to fall on the Faroe Islands, being 320 miles distant.—This volcano is in the island of Iceland, in lat. 65 degs. north, and but 5 degs. south of the magnetic pole.
