A KILLING RUNAWAY.

William Lee, at the Risk of His Own, Saves a Child's Life.

Double Session of District Court—Beneficial Educational Matters—Sent to Asylum.

Yesterday what might have proven a fatal accident, was prevented by the presence of mind of William Lee, property man at the Grand Opera House. A man hitched to a light rig was fastened to a post in the rear of some buildings on Twenty-fourth street, a piece of paper was lying around and the animal who broke loose and dashed away with a little five-year-old boy in the vehicle. Billy soon took to the perilous situation of the little boy and quickly sprang to the wagon and grabbed the little boy in his arms and they both tumbled out onto the ground. The little fellow escaped uninjured, but Billy got several bruises in his fall.

DISTRICT COURT BUSINESS.

Two courts were again in session at the second district court yesterday, before Judge Hiles the taking of testimony in the case of Ford vs. U. P. R. R. The jury returned a verdict in favor of the plaintiff. After several hours of deliberation the jury brought in a verdict of no cause for action.

Before Judge Rolapp in the case of Nugent vs. Garfield, the testimony of several witnesses was examined, among them being Judge Hiles, O. W. Powers, P. L. Williams, each giving expert testimony to the fact that an attorney should receive for various court work.
