

FIGHT FOR RIGHTS OF POLICYHOLDERS

Suit to Prevent N. Y. Life Trustees Conducting an Administration Campaign.

DENY COMPANY FUNDS USED.

Cashiers Say They Worked for Ticket But Did Not Use Any Money.

New York, Nov. 8.—Justice Dowling, in the New York state supreme court, today heard arguments of counsel for the international policyholders' committee and the New York Life Insurance company in an attempt by a policyholder to prevent the trustees of the company from expending its funds in conducting a campaign to elect the administration ticket of trustees, Stephen Farrelly of this city, was the policyholder who applied to the courts for an injunction to restrain an alleged waste of the company's funds and an accounting of the funds already expended in the campaign.

It is alleged in the complaint that the defendants caused to be printed 500,000 ballots similar to the official ballot sent them in return envelopes and placed them in the hands of the company with instructions to place on each ballot the number of a policy and to cross the names of this city, was the policyholder who applied to the courts for an injunction to restrain an alleged waste of the company's funds and an accounting of the funds already expended in the campaign.

Samuel Untermyer, counsel for the international policyholders' committee, appeared for Mr. Farrelly. He said that the trustees of the New York Life Insurance company were taking advantage of the policyholders in the insurance law to pass the object for which the policy was made. The defendants, he said, had omitted to say that the ticket was scratched was that of the administration. He charged that the work of distributing the number of the policy was done by officials of the company and at the expense of the policyholders and that it was done in violation of the law. Mr. Untermyer said that the policyholders had appealed to the committee to prevent a misuse of their funds. James H. McIntosh, attorney for the New York Life Insurance company, said the electioneering campaign was perfectly fair.

The agents informed each policyholder that there were two tickets in the field, and asked him to vote. The election ticket, said the agents, was sent at the expense of the company. Mr. McIntosh then submitted affidavits from President A. E. Orr and Vice President Kingley, denying that the directors were interested in any way with the election of a ticket by the policyholders.

The affidavit of Mr. Kingsley admitted that \$20,000 of the company's funds had been expended in the election, but merely for the use of such policyholders as might desire it, and to facilitate their voting.

A writ of habeas corpus was granted by the court, and the company's funds were ordered to be used for the election of a ticket by the policyholders.

Agency Inspector Dussel, in an affidavit, said he had spent between \$700 and \$800 in endeavoring to get the administration ticket elected, but it was out of his own pocket.

The affidavits of the cashiers in the different offices throughout the country were next submitted. They said they were all working in support of the administration ticket because they believed in it and that no money had been paid out by them for the purpose of conducting the election campaign.

Adjournment was taken until tomorrow.

SCULPTOR S. J. KITSON DEAD.
New York, Nov. 8.—Samuel J. Kitson, the sculptor, who had studied in New York and Boston, died at 1 o'clock this morning. Kidney disease was the cause of death.

Mr. Kitson was born in England 53 years ago. He was the principal sculptor of the interior work in the house of W. K. Vanderbilt in this city. His other works include the Sheridan monument at Arlington, Va., North's Price Soldiers and Sailors' monument at Hartford, Conn., and a portrait of Gov. Greenhalge in the state house at Boston.

CONSUL HAYWOOD ARRIVES.
San Francisco, Nov. 8.—William Haywood, American consul-general in Korea, has arrived here on the Pacific mail liner Korea. Within a few weeks his arrival at Seoul Mr. Haywood was taken ill with pulmonary trouble. His physician ordered him to Arizona as being the only place where he would have a chance to reach his health.

He is accompanied by his wife and two children. His condition is said to be serious and little hope is entertained for his recovery.

CUMMINS' PLURALITY 22,456.
Des Moines, Ia., Nov. 8.—Complete returns from the Iowa election show Gov. Cummins, Republican, is re-elected by a plurality of 22,456. Cummins received 156,622 votes, and Porter, his Democratic opponent, 134,166.

METHODIST MINISTER MAY HAVE TO GO TO PRISON.

Indianapolis, Nov. 8.—William E. Hinshaw, a Methodist minister, convicted of murder, was sentenced to prison for wife murder in 1905, and paroled conditionally in 1905. He was today arrested near Winchester on charges issued by Gov. H. H. and was brought to the governor's face late this morning to show cause why he should be returned to prison.

The complaint, supported by affidavits, was made to the governor by George R. Freeman, sheriff-elect of Wabash county. The Hinshaw and Freeman's wife have been guilty of improper conduct since his release from prison.

DEMOCRATS CARRY OKLAHOMA.

Guthrie, Okla., Nov. 8.—It is probable that the Democrats will have 59 delegates in the constitutional convention, which convenes here Tuesday, Nov. 21, later returns from the two territories justifying the estimate as conservative. The last Oklahoma district, the Third, elected a Democrat, making a total of 59 from Oklahoma alone. Three Indian Territory and one Oklahoma district will be contested.

S. F. POLICYHOLDERS WANT GOVERNMENT TO AID THEM.

Washington, Nov. 8.—The policyholders of San Francisco today appealed to the state department to aid them in forcing a settlement with three German insurance companies and one Austrian company that refused to pay for any of the property destroyed by fire and earthquake, which damages aggregated about \$14,000,000.

Messrs. Thomas and Sutro, San Francisco attorneys, representing the policyholders, called at the state department today and laid the facts before Asst. Secy. Bacon, who told them that it would scarcely be possible for this government to make the matter a subject of formal demand upon the German government. He did, however, undertake to do everything in his power to forward their mission and will give them letters of introduction to the American Ambassador in Berlin and instruct Ambassador Tower to render assistance. Mr. Thomas expects to proceed to Germany at once to complain in person to the government there of the action of the German insurance companies in evading service of the California courts and failing to settle with the policyholders.

Mr. Bacon later on took up this matter with Count Hatzfeld, the first secretary of the German embassy, and it was discussed at some length.

ATTEMPTED LYNCHING.

Mob of 500 in Spring Green, Wis., Was Bent on Hanging an Assaulter.

Spring Green, Wis., Nov. 8.—A mob of 500 persons attempted to lynch Thomas Baif, on his arrival here today under arrest, charged with assault on Mrs. Edward Frank. The prisoner was rushed to jail. The mob, nevertheless, suspended a noose from a water tower and made ready for a lynching. The crowd surged around the jail and declared that Baif would be hanged at 3 o'clock when he was brought out for a hearing.

It is charged Baif, after assaulting Mrs. Frank, threw her over a fence. Being so badly hurt she could not walk, she was compelled to crawl nearly a mile to a neighbor's house. She will recover.

At 9:40 the officers rushed the prisoner through the streets with the mob in pursuit and succeeded in reaching the town safely. Baif was returned to Madison, where he is in jail.

CONCENTRATING MILL BURNED.

Idaho Springs, Colo., Nov. 8.—In some unaccountable manner the Alpine concentrating mill in this city caught fire today and the contents were completely destroyed. Only the small office building, situated 100 feet from the main structure, was saved.

The concentrating works was owned by the Indiana Gold Mining & Milling company, which is composed largely of Evansville (Ind.) capitalists. The plant represented an outlay of over \$50,000, but only \$20,000 insurance was carried. It is generally believed the fire was of incendiary origin.
