Editor Deseret News:

The August election has taught our religio-political foes a lesson. They admit, so I am credibly informed, that we were right and they were wrong. Yet they claim to have been sincere. Well, it may be so, and in some cases probably is. Jesus said, "he that killeth you will think he doth God's service." If they can reap any consolation from the reflection that they were so consummately ignorant as to perpetrate such stupid and wholesale blunders innocently when they were told better by parties who knew the law, so far as I am concerned, they are welcome to all the comfort thus derived, especially those who refused to register and then swore they never had the chance. There were quite a number of the most prominent "liberals" of Beaver City who offered to bet from \$50 to \$100 each that the registration officer had never asked them to register, but the assessor and collector, who, by the way, is very accurate in those matters, called in the county clerk, who allowed him to go through that class of papers and put them to themselves. After having found the last one, he faced them down, assuring them that he could produce their affidavits, signed with their own hands. They still insisted on his taking bets, which he refused, telling them he did not want their money. He could easily have taken from \$300 to \$500, but declined to get money in that way. He, however, invited them to call at the county clerk's office, which some did, and the assessor showed them their own signatures to affidavits which they had sworn to. To others he took the trouble to carry their affidavits, and every one had to acknowledge that it was his own handwriting. All they could say was they had forgotten it. I mentioned this some time ago, giving the credit to the county clerk, Bro. William Fotheringham, who merited all the praise I awarded him, but I was not then aware of the hot contest with the assessor, Bro. Josiah Rogerson, who deserves credit for his great care and painstaking which aided so materially in saving the election to the people. He is also entitled to much credit for resisting the temptation to accept their money when he knew it was within his reach.

(I was mistaken in my last about the County Court ordering two special elections for Milford; the second special for precinct officers was hooked on to the election for Delegate to Congress.)

The liberal vote for Delegate to Congress was only about one third, or a trifle over what it was for county and precinct officers at the August election. The main point of difference being that the "liberals" have learned better than to attempt any further stupid frauds upon the people. The latter will not submit to them.

Another reason for the liberal defeat is, they ignored our advice to run Boreman rather than spoil another man. He was already politically damned, and as we told them at the time, they would have nothing to lose. Mr. Campbell came to Beaver County a few years ago a poor miner, of mere ordinary ability, and seemed well adapted to digging holes in the ground. He succeeded in company with three or four others in striking a rich lead; he became, I understand, a millionaire. Maxwell and Baskin had well nigh drained the pockets of the clique in paying their expenses, and hence a new plan must be hit upon. If Campbell did not possess statesmanship or ability, "he had the rocks" and could pay his own expenses. This is the view taken here. We look upon Mr. Campbell as a mere catspaw for the party. His signal defeat in his own county, as well as the returns from the strongholds (?) of the "liberals" in other counties, are abundant proofs that our conclusions are correct. They also show that a contemptible anti-Mormon and anti-American clique is on its last legs.
