WATER EXTENSION WANTED.

A meeting was held yesterday of the waterworks committee to hear a petition from the trustees of the State Industrial school who want the waterworks system extended from Seventh street to the institution. The matter has been discussed, but no decision has been reached.

NEW TEACHERS NAMED.

The board of education held a meeting last evening and elected Mrs. Wade principal of the Five Points school; Prof. Herold, principal of the Central school; Mrs. Colledge, principal of the Mount Zion school. The superintendent's monthly report was read and about fifty bills were paid.

Agnes Virginia, the 10 months old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Daniel B. Cronin, died on Tuesday night from a short illness with pneumonia. Funeral services were held at the family residence this afternoon, being conducted by the Rev. Father O'Donohue of St. Patrick's church. A large concourse of friends of the family escorted the remains to their last resting place in the city cemetery. The Cronins have another child very ill with the same disease.
