

REPUBLICANISM AGAIN TRIUMPHS

Elects Every Man on General Ticket but One — R. P. Morris, Nominee for Treasurer, the Lone Democrat Who Escaped the Wide-Sweeping Avalanche — Eleven Republicans and Four Democratic Councilmen.

NEW CITY OFFICERS. Mayor—Ezra Thompson. Recorder—J. O. Nyström. Auditor—A. S. Reiser. Treasurer—R. P. Morris, (only Democrat elected). Attorney—George L. Nye. Judges—Christopher B. Diehl, Henry S. Tanner.

Republicanism has again triumphed in Salt Lake as well as in most of the other important cities of Utah. Locally the whole Republican ticket with a single exception is elected by majorities so large and decisive as to leave absolutely no room for doubt.

The council will be one more than Republican. The Democratic nominees, Fernstrom, Arnold and Davis of the Third are all elected.

COUNCILMANIC VOTE.

How the Rivals in Municipal Wards Came Out. In the precincts there was a great deal of interest manifested over the contest between the councilmen and after the votes were counted it was found that eleven Republicans and four Democrats had been elected.

FOURTH PRECINCT. District No. Thirty-seven, Thirty-eight, Thirty-nine, Forty, Forty-one, Forty-two, Forty-three, Forty-four, Forty-five, Forty-six. Total, Majority.

FIFTH PRECINCT. District No. Forty-four, Forty-five, Forty-six, Forty-seven, Forty-eight, Forty-nine, Fifty, Fifty-one, Fifty-two. Total, Majority.

PRECINCT DETAILS. Vote was Very Light Up to Near Time of Closing Polls. With few exceptions the vote in all the districts was a very light one during the first hours of the day and the campaign managers were fearful that this condition of affairs would affect the result to either side.

PLURALITIES. Thompson, mayor, over Leary, 1,240. Nyström, recorder, over Swan, 1,575. Morris, treasurer, over Lester, 1,100. Diehl and Tanner, judges, over Thomason and Sommer, 2,071 and 1,745.

AT LOGAN. Surprise of the Decade Confronted the Democrats. For the first time in ten years the Republican party took almost every thing it wanted in Logan and the consequence was a surprise to the Democrats that has not been felt by that party in a decade.

OTHER UTAH CITIES. RESULT IN OGDEN. Glassmann and the Republican Ticket Victorious. Ogdén never saw such a landslide as the one that yesterday carried William Glassmann into the mayor's chair and at the same time elected to office every Republican nominee for public office in the municipality.

PROVO REPUBLICAN. While Provo went Republican, the head of the ticket was slaughtered and C. E. Loose, the party's nominee, was subjected to defeat at the hands of T. N. Taylor, Democrat.

AMERICAN FORK REPUBLICAN. But two members of the council were elected by Democrats at American Fork and the Republicans got away with most of the plums with these figures: Mayor—W. S. Robinson (D), 579; J. J. Jackson (R), 256.

SPRINGVILLE DEMOCRATIC. High license is again snowed under in Springville. The Republican vote was behind the showing made a year ago.

SPANISH FORK DEMOCRATIC. Democrats and Citizens did the business at Spanish Fork, the former electing their officers: H. C. Jex for mayor, Samuel Brockbank, J. M. Creer and Hyrum Christensen for the council.

PLEASANT GROVE DEMOCRATIC. Leaving behind their candidates for mayor and marshal, the Democrats of Pleasant Grove elected their entire ticket, as follows: Mayor, Daniel Wadley (R), 198; Joseph E. Thorn (D), 197.

FILLMORE REPUBLICAN. The entire Republican ticket in Fillmore was elected by a large majority, the officers elected being as follows: Mayor—Geo. Velle.

ENREKA DEMOCRATIC. Eureka gave one of the exceptional results of election day, returning to office none but Democrats, as follows: Mayor—H. F. Fullin (R); H. F. Gear (D), 492; George's majority, 102.

COALVILLE REPUBLICAN. With the exception of one councilman and the city marshal, the Republicans carried away everything at Coalville: Mayor—Frank Croft (R), 172; J. L. Boyden (D), 78.

WORKINGMEN AT MERCER. Local politics controlled in the election at Mercer and the Workingmen's ticket was counted victorious over the Citizens' ticket, electing these officers: Mayor—Geo. D. Luft.
