MANY VETERANS SEE BIKE RACES

Splendid Program Given at Salt Palace Saucer Track—W. E. Samuelson Breaks Five Mile Record.

One of the best programs of the season was given at the saucer track down at the Salt Palace last evening and there was a big crowd present, many of them being G.A.R. veterans, and to say they enjoyed the races is but putting it mildly. The crowd was so large the seats were found inadequate and several hundred crowded down into the arena.

The races were above the average, the sprint events all being hotly contested and one world's record was lowered. The latter was accomplished by W. E. Samuelson, paced by his brother T. M., in the five-mile motor-paced race against time. Walther's record was 6:40.45, but Samuelson brought it down to 6:25.25.

The five-mile western championship, amateur, was a pretty race, the bunch setting a fast clip from the crack of the gun. Hume, Wright and "Burglar" McCormack, fighting it out desperately. On the final spur McCormack got the lead and maintained it though both Wright and Hume tried in vain to head him off. Lawson captured the mile open, professional. Saxon Williams upset the talent by defeating Pyle in their Australian pursuit race. A summary of the events follows:

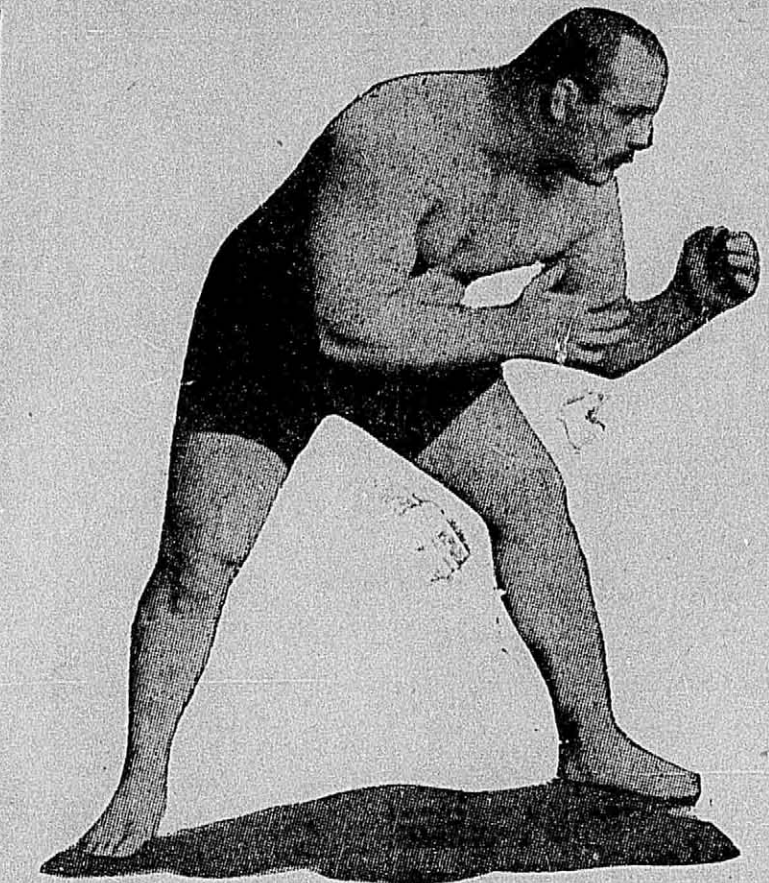

RETURNS DIAMOND MEDAL. New York, Aug. 11.—Oro Morningstar, champion professional billiard player at the 182 ball line game, has returned the diamond medal, emblematic of his supremacy, to the company which awarded it to him and, with Willie Hoppe, will be a free lance in the professional game.
