THE MORMON CASES. - Washington April 15.-The Supreme Court of the United States this morning unanimously reversed the judgment of the Supreme Court of Utah in the Mormon test case, Englebrecht vs. Clinton. It held that the jury was unlawfully drawn, the sumonses invalid, the indictments violations of the law, and that all proceedings must be dismissed. This decision quashes all the criminal business in the Utah courts last year, and renders civil judgments invalid where contested. It is decided that the Marshal of the United States in the Territory has only the same authority as in the State, consequently the ces. Mormon murder indictments are personal trespasses. Criminal proceedings can only be commenced de novo under the United States law. 'The entire judicial decision of Judge McKean is overthrown,-Chicago Post.


