In the fall of 1873, he went to the Rastern States to gather genealogies of his ancestors, and returned in July of the following year, having been very successful in he labors; in November, 1877, to his great joy, he left his home for St. George to there officiate in the Holy Temple for his dead, and in January, 1878, he returned, having recomplished the desire of his heart and Teling greatly hiessed.


