## OBITUARY.

ELISHA JONES, of Heber City, Wasatch County, Utah Territory, died on the 18th day of August, A. D. 1880. Deceased was born on the 11th day of June, A. D. 1813, in the town of Wam, Jefferson County, in the State of Ohio. He joined the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints on the 3rd of March, 1847, being baptized by his brother James in the night time on account of the persecution raging against the Saints at that time. He immediately began to make preparations to start for Winter Quarters with his family, arrived there July 27th, 1847. In the spring of 1848, moved with his family to Kanabville. In the year 1850 started for Salt Lake Valley, arriving there on the 7th of September, 1850. Moved to Provo City, in Utah County, in 1853. Served there as a member of the City Council for a number of years. Moved to Sanpete County, and finally to Heber City,

Wasatch County, where he continued to reside until his decease. He was faithful to the requirements of the gospel, and was always on hand to administer to the sick and wait upon those needing help. He always endeavored to support home industries and took the DESERET NEWS constantly from the first. Was a firm supporter of the truth, and a servant of God. He has left a large family to mourn his loss.—COM.

August 30, 1880, of inflammatory rheumatism, after confinement to his bed nearly two years, JAMES JACK, a native of Scotland, generally known as Captain Jack of the Texas Rangers; aged 80 years, a pump maker by trade.
