At Peoa, Summit County, Utah, November 1st, 1880, THOMAS M., infant son of Thos. M. and Ann Eliza Neel; aged 1 year and 6 months.

In Centerville, Davis County, Sept. 11, 1880, of old age, MARY ANN HARRIS, wife of John J. Harris, daughter of Thomas and Elizabeth Rushmer, born September 25, 1798, in the Parish of Fethorpe, County of Norfolk, England; was baptized into the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, on the 20th day of April, 1847; emigrated to Utah on the 19th day of January, arrived in Salt Lake City, October 10th the same year. In 1858, went with her family to Payson, and returned to Salt Lake City the fall of the same year. A short time after moved with her family to Centerville, Davis County, where she resided until the day of her death. She passed away in peace without a struggle.—COM.

In the 14th Ward, Nov. 19th, 1880, at 9 a.m. of inflammation of the lungs and typhoid fever, MARY KATIE, daughter of H. E. and M. C. Phelps, born in this city November 7, 1877.

In the 10th Ward of this city, November 22nd, 1880, of diphtheria, GEORGE ALMA, son of John W. and Aquila E. Kedington, aged 11 months and 17 days.

At Riverdale, of old age, at the residence of her son-in-law, Peter Yorgansen, November 13th, 1880, ELLEN BUTLER. Deceased was born at Versom, Knastrop Socken, Malmolund, Sweden, October 13th, 1790. She emigrated to the Territory in 1854, and practiced midwifery very successfully for 32 years up to within a month of the date of her death. She lived and died a faithful Latter-day Saint. Brother Stratton embraced the gospel when a boy, and emigrated to this country in 1851 with the company that came out with President John Taylor for the purpose of establishing a woolen factory, and he has been in Pres. Taylor's employ almost ever since. He was a faithful man, highly esteemed by a large circle of friends, by whom his loss will be keenly felt, as well as by his bereaved family. He leaves a wife and five children, the oldest of whom is 11 years of age.

At his residence in Coalville, Summit County, Utah, on Saturday, November 13th, at 1.15 o'clock, after a long and severe illness, JOHN SPRIGGS. He was buried on Friday, November 18th.

Deceased was born in Pembroke, Wales, on the 24th day of June, 1818. He was a man who was well known and respected by a large number of friends and acquaintances. He has left to mourn his loss a large family, consisting of a wife, four sons and seven daughters, and 39 grandchildren. He was one of Utah's early settlers, having come to this valley in October, 1853. Soon after his arrival he made his home in Brigham City, and started a home industry of tanning leather and manufacturing boots and shoes. He afterwards became famous as the first discoverer of coal in Coalville, Summit County, and while he was thus engaged prospecting, himself and family endured many hardships, but he stuck to it with that tenacity of purpose which has characterized him throughout his life, and when he found coal he was the first to bring it to the Salt Lake City market, and later developments show how successful he was in prospecting the right place.—COM.

At Glenwood, on the 4th of November, 1880, EDITH ROZILLA, daughter of Joseph W. and Fanny Allan (of scarlet fever). Deceased was born August 23, 1877, and died November 4, 1880, aged 3 years, 3 months and 11 days.
