Provo, Utah, May 5.—Suits have been filed in the Fourth district court by Lewis S. Robinson, administrator of the estate of Mary Richards, deceased, against Joseph E. Thorne, administrator of the estate of Peter Greenhalgh, deceased. Plaintiff alleges that on January 18th, 1890, defendant wrongfully and without right came into possession of \$3,114 cash and household goods to the value of \$125, which he has refused to deliver to plaintiff, who claims that said property belongs to the estate of Mary Richards, of which plaintiff was appointed administrator April 6th, 1890. Mrs. Greenhalgh died at Pleasant Grove in January of this year and left the property in question. Mrs. Richards, who died later, was a friend of Mrs. Greenhalgh and waited upon her during her sickness. It is understood that the plaintiff claims that at the time Mrs. Richards was attending Mrs. Greenhalgh the latter gave Mrs. Richards her keys and told her to look after her (Mrs. Greenhalgh's) property, which will probably not be disputed, and also that Mrs. Greenhalgh gave her personal property to Mrs. Richards; and that the suit is brought on the strength of this alleged gift of the property in dispute. That such gift was made will be determined by the administrator of the Greenhalgh estate.

MEETS A FRIGHTFUL DEATH.
John P. Smith Crushed Between Two Freight Cars.

Eureka, Utah Co., May 5.—Last evening at about 5 o'clock John P. Smith fell between two freight cars on the Rio Grande Western switch near the Centennial Eureka house and was almost instantly killed. Mr. Smith was employed by the Centennial Eureka Mining company and was his duty to fill the cars with ore from the ore house and after they had been filled he would load the trucks and let them run slowly down the grade to make room for other empty ones. The railroad company had switched a few cars on to the track above the ore bins and Smith was standing on the top of the cars down the grade as had been his custom when in some manner the car became unmanageable and ran away down the grade past the ore house and struck Smith, crushing him between the two cars. The accident had been fatal and death was almost instantaneous.
