BREEDEN ON SALT LANDS Attorney General Tells How Placer

Locators Are Working to Secure Valuable Proposition.

Attorney General Breeden says rel-Attorney General Breeden says rel-ative to the attempt on the part of locators to get possession of about 40,-000 acres of salt lands in Tooele coun-ty, by filing placer claims, that in his opinion, it is clearly based on a miscon-struction of the reading of the enabl-ing act of the state. The act specifies contain 100 000 acres. "Including all ing act of the state. The act specifies certain 100,000 acres, "including all saline lands" as set aside for and be-longing to the University of Utah. The placer locators set up the claim that "including" meant the lands within the 160,000 acres specified, and had nothing to do with the great saline land area in northwestern Utah. Attorney General Breeden says he dropped onto their game seven months ago, when he notified McGuinness, their counsel, that the lands belonged to the university, and immediately ap-plied for an injunction from the court, restraining the land jumpers from tak-

restraining the land jumpers from tak-ing possession. Judge Armstrong granted the request, and denied a demurrer of the defendants setting forth their allegations. The thereupon carried the matter to gress, where they are working through Senator Sutherland to pass a bill sus-taining their interpretation of the wording of the section in the enabling

act. Judge Breeden was told by Judge Armstrong that while the matter was pending in Congress, he could not give judgment. So the question rests for the present. As it is very doubt-ful whether under the pressure of bushees. Congress will act on the preousiness, Congress will act on the pro-osed legislation at this session, Judge urmstrong will probably act after congress has adjourned. Judge Congress has adjourned. Judge Breeden says the valuation of the sait lands in question is not over \$1,000,-000 at the farthest, instead of \$400,-600,000, as certain Washington cor-respondents put the figures. But at the same time, he says, the publica-tion of these figures may cause con-sressmen to believe they are correct and be the means of the government's relusing to let the lands go to anyone. lusing to let the lands go to anyone but be preserved for the government to accordance with the policy of Pres-ident Roosevelt to conserve for the people great national resources.
