SALT LAKE AND PACIFIC.

The Name Adopted for the Railway to Deep Creek.

Committee Actively at Work in Planning the Scheme to a Successful Issue.

The Deep Creek railroad committee held a meeting last evening, and discussed matters pertaining to the proposed railway. It was agreed that the capital stock of the company to be formed would be \$1,000,000, in shares of \$5 each.

Mayor Bacon, H. W. and Wallace, the committee to inquire into the feasibility of building a railway to Deep Creek, reported that they had seen President Negh W. Clayton of the Salt Lake and Pacific Railroad company, while he was not prepared to make any definite proposition, that his company would be willing to either make a package arrangement or to accept a proposition for consideration.

Mr. Bacon said that he had seen Mr. Negh, who assured him that his company could supply a large amount of light rails and engines at very reasonable prices.

Chairman Donnellan stated that he had obtained information from both the Salt Lake and Pacific Railroad company and the Utah Pacific, that they were anxious to make an arrangement with the Salt Lake City road. However, he believed that an arrangement could be made at the present time, as it would jeopardize the subscription.
