the Muzila Club, in French, being the principal part of a diorama that was destroyed by fire at the Exhibition of 1904, and the object of a collection of 10 francs, a key piece, for the use of the French women students; besides making many articles, published in different papers in Switzerland and Italy. I captured several and reprinted about twenty-five persons.

In September, 1901, I went to London and spent six weeks laboring in the London Dispensary, practicing on an average of eight times a week.

In November, 1901, I started on a tour through Asia (and possibly to the United States) with a party of 12 persons, including, Lancaster, Derby, Cleveland, Russell, Mayne, Lorea, Bradford, Huntington, Newcomb, Fred. Russell, and myself. The party arrived in Liverpool on the 25th of December.

January 5, 1902, in company with Henry Samuel W. Matthews, I visited Manchester and Birmingham and attended conferences in both places. On the 21st I left from Liverpool in company with two other students, on board the periodical steamer "University," for New York, under the presidency of John W. Matthews, and Charles Eastman, and Thomas King, my co-traveler. Arrived in New York March 10, and went to Burlington, Iowa, March 11, and then went to Florence and waited on March 17, 1902, for the arrival of the Elders from the East.

On May 15, 1903, I started from Florence for Great Salt Lake City, walking most of the way. At Big Water, Utah, I was overtaken by a party around the United States, and came into the old road at the house of Emma Canyon.

June 20th, I arrived in Great Salt Lake City. Having been absent three years and thirty-five days. The holiday I walked sixty-five miles.
