

ENGLISH LIBERALS ISSUE MANIFESTO

If Peers' Action Is Not Repudiated, Rights and Privileges Will be Lost.

VETO MUST BE RESTRICTED.

Rosebery Repudiates Curzon's Charge That He Led Army to Fortress Walls Then Abandoned It.

London, Dec. 1.—The National Liberal federation tonight issued a manifesto to the country, which may be regarded as a party rally for the elections. It concentrates attention entirely on the constitutional struggle between the house of lords and the house of commons. It says: "If the present action of the peers is not repudiated swiftly by the people, rights and privileges won so dearly by our forefathers in the great struggles for freedom are all surrendered." The manifesto declares the peers' power of veto must be restricted so that the last word on legislation and finance will rest with the house of commons. Otherwise, no Liberal minis-

try again can assume the responsibilities of office. "In the fight forced upon us," the manifesto continues, "the electors will have to decide whether they wish to govern themselves or be governed at second hand by a few hundred hereditary peers who have thrown the constitution into the melting pot in order to shift the burden of taxation from wealthy land and liquor interests to food and the necessities of life."

The cabinet, which had already determined on the policy it would pursue in the event of Lord Lansdowne's amendment being carried, held an unusually early meeting today to consider the motion, which Premier Asquith will ask the house of commons to adopt. All the members of the cabinet were present at the meeting, which excited so much popular interest that a great crowd gathered in the vicinity of No. 10 Downing street, the official residence of the premier. The election campaign will open in earnest on Friday, when David Lloyd-George, chancellor of the exchequer, and Winston Spencer Churchill, president of the board of trade, who are held chiefly responsible for the budget, and Lord Lansdowne and J. Austen Chamberlain, the most ardent opponents of the government measure, will deliver speeches and with the exception of a brief respite at Christmas, will continue the fight until election day. In many respects the impending struggle will be the most interesting in the parliamentary history of England. Some of the peers have decided to take the unusual course of stumping the country to explain their action in voting against the budget. The Unionists, although not so well equipped with orators, are determined upon a stern campaign. They will devote their energies to the exposition of tariff reform and a denunciation of socialism, towards which they will claim the budget is a first step.

The Laborites, all strong supporters of the budget, will meet tomorrow to arrange their campaign and efforts are being made, and with some success, to prevent a three-cornered contest. As a part of this program the Laborites are withdrawing their candidates from those districts where the Liberals have a better chance of success, while the Liberals are doing a similar service for the Labor party, where the latter is stronger. The election in Ireland will be the most interesting since 1886.

SECY. OF WAR DICKINSON RECOMMENDS CHANGES

Washington, Dec. 1.—Many changes in the military establishment are suggested by Secy. of War Dickinson in his annual report. He recommends: A change in the Roosevelt physical tests so as to require of officers, in addition to the annual, a weekly riding or walking test. The division of the United States into territorial and tactical districts so that the organized militia of the state may be conveniently combined with the regular army stationed therein into permanent brigades, divisions and corps, and for instruction and tactical organization.

The location of troops in or near the principal cities instead of distributing them at remote forts, to meet the requirements of economy, possibility of rapid movement and the training of the militia. More officers for the army, and promotion on the merit system. Liberal appropriations for the completion of fortification projects of the Philippines, Honolulu and Pearl Harbor. Encouragement of rifle practice among citizens and schoolboys. The establishment of a national park at Niagara Falls to preserve its scenic features. The secretary made public his estimates to Congress for the coming fiscal year amounting to \$35,325,339, or \$8,000,000 less than appropriated for the present fiscal year.

MRS. EMELINE PANKHURST SAILS FOR ENGLAND

New York, Dec. 1.—To a cheering crowd of suffragette Mrs. Emeline Pankhurst, the British suffragette leader, waved farewell today as she departed on the steamer Teutonic for England. "My stay in America has been pleasant to me throughout," said Mrs. Pankhurst. "It is a matter of much regret, however, that the suffragette movement has not yet reached greater height. Much credit is due to the good sense of the American women that they have come to appreciate the cause of women's suffrage, much through love." Mrs. Pankhurst will serve a 30-day sentence in an English jail on her return. She declared she and other suffragettes who will also pass 30 days in jail, "just would not eat the prison food but would bring on a hunger strike."

PAID FINES FOR DEFRAUDING GOVERNMENT

Portland, Or., Dec. 2.—Fines aggregating \$45,000 were paid into the federal court here yesterday by 12 leading citizens of Umatilla county who had pleaded guilty technically to having defrauded the government of part of the public domain. Col. J. H. Rully, one of the most prominent attorneys of eastern Oregon, paid the heaviest fine, \$10,000. The others who pleaded guilty were stockmen, ranchers and business and professional men. All will be able to pay the fines without embarrassment.

AMERICAN BIBLE SOCIETY HOPES TO RAISE \$200,000

New York, Dec. 2.—The American Bible society hopes to raise \$200,000 during the present month to complete a \$500,000 fund which it must have in its treasury by Dec. 31, in order to receive a like amount from Mrs. Russell Sage for an endowment fund. Subscriptions received this week included the largest and smallest single contributions so far acknowledged. Both gifts were from women, one being for \$25,000 from an anonymous donor, and the other for 10 cents, from a poor woman in Georgia.

MOTORBOAT OWNERS WILL MAKE A PROTEST

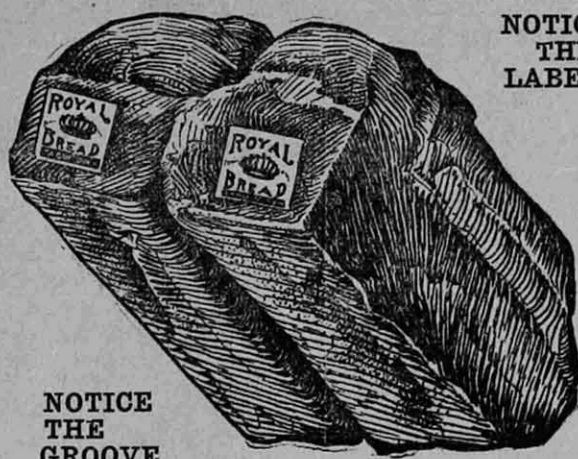
New York, Dec. 2.—Delegates from most of the motorboat organizations in the United States, representing more than 100,000 owners and users of powerboats, met here yesterday to protest against the adoption by Congress of proposed drastic laws for the regulation of motor craft. Commodore C. W. Kotcher of Detroit, was president at the meeting and a petition was drawn up which will be presented to Congress, declaring that the Humphreys bill now before the house of representatives is too sweeping in its provisions and should not be enacted.

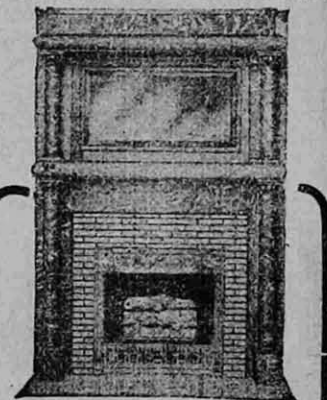

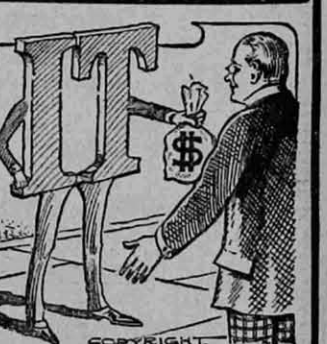
