A Man's Memory Entirely Lost as the Result of an Accident.

SHOCKING SUICIDE OF A MOTHER.

Bethel, Maine. Officials — A Boy Sent to Jail for Robbing His Uncle — Other Items.

The Owyhee County court has again granted further the process of making a copy of the Chinese census returns of the old Worcester Path.

Philip G. Kinner, the entrepreneur of the Chinese laundry in the charge of H. C. Kinner, in the Chinese Laundry, San Fran- cisco, has been sentenced to one year's imprisonment in the Alcatraz Island.
